1. BILL SUMMARY

- 1. Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE relating to the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games; setting fees and charges for the Games and waiving all special event fees under Chapter 15.52 of the Seattle Municipal Code, and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.
- 2. Summary and background of the Legislation:** The Special Olympics is the world’s largest sports organization for people with intellectual disabilities. Seattle will be hosting the 2018 Special Olympics USA Games in Seattle July 1 through July 6, 2018, with the support of community leaders and corporate partners. Approximately 3,000 athletes will be competing in activities and sports at venues around the City. Without a special ordinance setting fees and charges, the Special Olympics USA Games would be subject to special event fees under Section 15.52.070 of the Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) for administrative and staffing requirements, including staff from the Seattle Police Department. Expressing commitment to being a city of diversity and inclusion, and being honored to be a part of a celebration to break down barriers and promote inclusion, the City via this ordinance would waive City venue charges and special event fees under SMC Chapter 15.52.

Permit fees under SMC Chapter 15.52 and any City venue charges will be waived for the Special Olympics in Seattle. According to Office of Economic Development (OED) staff, charges that would normally be assessed under SMC Chapter 15.52 include the application fee (\$75), administrative fee (\$200), plus the cost of Seattle Police Department staffing for the University of Washington Husky Stadium (roughly \$31,000). According to OED, street parking and closing ceremony costs are not special event costs that would be charged under SMC Chapter 15.52 due to the non-profit nature of the entity and open event.
