5 AN ORDINANCE related to appropriations for the Seattle Information Technology Department;
6 amending Ordinance 125207, which adopted the 2017 budget; lifting a proviso; and

9 WHEREAS, The City of Seattle's 2017 Adopted Budget included, in the Seattle Information

10 Technology Department budget control level, a proviso concerning the procurement and

11 operations of body-worn video (BWV) for Seattle Police Department (SPD) officers; and

12 WHEREAS, the proviso allows only limited spending related to BWV until a future ordinance
13 releases the restrictions on expenditures; and

14 WHEREAS, the City Council anticipated that such ordinance would not be passed until SPD

15 reconvened the BWV stakeholder workgroup identified in a 2016 Green Sheet (81-1-A-

16 2-2016); sought its advice; developed an action plan for community engagement;

17 documented how SPD will continue to engage and seek advice of the BWV stakeholder

18 workgroup; and submitted to Council a final report summarizing community outreach,

19 responsiveness to community input, and identified unresolved questions related to the

20 BWV policy and protocols; and

21 WHEREAS, the Seattle Police Department submitted a detailed action plan for community

22 engagement to the Gender Equity, Safe Communities and New Americans Committee on

23 December 2, 2016, in accordance with 2017 Green Sheet 207-1-B-1; and

24 WHEREAS, the Seattle Police Department has successfully completed all steps outlined in 2017

25 Green Sheet 207-1-B-1 and completed an initial deployment of body-worn cameras to

1 Seattle Police Department bicycle officers, and is prepared to begin precinct deployment
2 of BWV in The City of Seattle; NOW, THEREFORE,

3 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

4 Section 1. The restrictions imposed by the following budget proviso, which limits
5 spending on the following item, are removed because the conditions set forth in the proviso have
6 been satisfied and they are no longer restrictions for any purpose, including those set forth in
7 Subsection 1(b) of Ordinance 125207:

1.1	Seattle Information Technology Department	207-1-B-1	“No money may be spent by the Seattle Police Department (SPD) or Seattle Information Technology Department (SeaIT) in 2017 on the acquisition of body-worn video (BWV) equipment until the Council passes a future ordinance lifting this proviso. It is envisioned that such ordinance will not be passed unless the following steps are completed by February 1, 2017: (1) SPD reconvenes the stakeholder workgroup formed under Green Sheet 81-1-A-2-2016 and seeks their advice regarding any outstanding issues or community concerns related to BWV protocols and policies; (2) SPD, in consultation with the stakeholder workgroup and Council, develops a detailed action plan for community engagement on body-worn video by December 2, 2016, that includes a plan for regularly sharing with the Gender Equity, Safe Communities, and New Americans Committee a status update on community engagement efforts; (3) SPD submits to the Council a final report that summarizes the results of the Department’s community outreach, describes how the draft BWV policy is responsive to community input and the	Citywide IT Initiatives (D9900)

			<p>operational needs of the department, and identifies unresolved questions or issues related to the BWV policy and implementation protocols; and,</p> <p>(4) SPD documents how the Department will continue to engage and seek the advice of the stakeholder workgroup on the use of BWV equipment.</p> <p>This proviso shall not apply to funds spent on preliminary activities related to acquisition of body-worn video equipment, including the following: (1) funds supported by the federal body-worn video grant received by the Seattle Police Department or the City’s matching funds for that grant and (2) funds expended for preliminary activities under a contract for the acquisition of body-worn video equipment. This proviso also shall not apply to costs associated with the deployment of body-worn cameras on downtown bicycle officers.”</p>	

1 Section 2. Any act consistent with the authority of this ordinance taken prior to its
 2 effective date is ratified and confirmed.


1 Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by
2 the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it
3 shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
