Background: Kari A. Lerum, Ph.D., is Associate Professor at the University of Washington Bothell. Kari's research, scholarship, and teaching focuses on social inequity through the lens of sexuality, gender, race, culture and power. Her work has included a coalition of sex work and human rights activists who influenced the Obama-run state department to recognize a UN recommendation to address violence against LGBTQ individuals and individuals in the sex trade. In her professional writing and speaking she has advocated for social justice approaches to both sex work and human trafficking policies, highlighting linkage between sexual, gender, racial, immigration, and economic rights and justice. She also examines the role of media in the production of social inequality and justice, particularly in the area of sexuality. At UWB and UWS she has also been active in efforts to provide more comprehensive anti-sexual and gender violence training as well as better support for survivors of domestic violence.
