1. BILL SUMMARY

1. **Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation to execute and accept from the Washington State Department of Natural Resources, on behalf of The City of Seattle, an Aquatic Lands Lease for Andrews Bay; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.
2. **Summary of the Legislation:** This legislation authorizes the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation to execute an Aquatic Lands Lease with the State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) for Andrews Bay in SE Seattle.
3. **Background:** The purpose of this project is the continued use and enjoyment of the water off Seward Park and consolidation of authority. This area is enjoyed by thousands of people in the summer. There is not a clear line between City ownership and Washington State ownership. Lack of jurisdictional clarity has created problems in the summer months because of the City's inability to control unruly behavior, such as boating under the influence, amplified sound and other noise at inappropriate hours. This unruly behavior disturbs other park users and nearby homeowners. The Seattle Harbor Patrol will benefit from having the whole of Andrews Bay under the management of Seattle Parks and Recreation.
