

Civil Project Manager for a 12-story laboratory building above ground floor retail and landscaped plaza over five levels of below grade parking in the South Lake Union neighborhood of Seattle. KPFF provided civil engineering design services for the project, taking the lead on obtaining a Street Improvement Permit for right-of-way improvements and a Utility Major Permit for the undergrounding of an extensive overhead electrical and communications network surrounding the half-block development.

Civil Project Manager for design and Project Manager for construction administration of Montlake Triangle and Lower Rainier Vista, which serves as a new grand entrance to University of Washington Campus. A SIP was secured for extensive improvements in the right-of-way, including the lowering of NE Pacific Place by 17-feet. Rainier Vista was extended into the Montlake Triangle by adding a pedestrian landbridge over NE Pacific Place. Another bridge was added below the roadway to protect the University's utility tunnel from traffic loading.
