

Encampment Sites

1. Concentration in urban and transportation corridors

2. Significant scalability considerations

3. Few communities in the city are unaffected



Multi-Departmental Administrative Rule (MDAR)

Key Elements:

- 1. Defines unauthorized encampments and specifies operating hours for each property
- 2. Describes enforcement options
- 3. Provides a minimum of 72 hours notice to encampment occupants before removal of personal property
- 4. Provides opportunity for retrieval of personal items
- 5. Provides storage of personal items for up to 60 days

Multi-Departmental Administrative Rule (MDAR)

Key Elements of Encampment Removal Procedures:

- 1. Provides consistent, coordinated approach and procedures across all City departments
- 2. Directs the public and staff to work through the City's Customer Service Bureau to identify unauthorized encampments
- Provides outreach to unauthorized campers to connect them with needed services and shelter
- 4. Provides added shelter capacity if needed
