CITY OF SEATTLE 1 ORDINANCE 125005 2 COUNCIL BILL 118627 3 4 AN ORDINANCE relating to the 2016 Budget; amending Ordinance 124927, which adopted the 5 2016 Budget, including the 2016-2021 Capital Improvement Program (CIP); creating 6 nonexempt positions; adding new projects; and revising existing projects. 7 8 9 WHEREAS, Ordinance 124796 provided for the submission to the voters of Seattle a proposition 10 authorizing the City to levy regular property taxes for up to nine years in excess of the limitation on levies in chapter 84.55 RCW for the purpose of providing City facilities and 11 services, including transportation improvements, both capital and operating, with possible 12 13 debt financing, and creation of a new oversight committee; and WHEREAS, the proposed levy was approved by Seattle voters on November 3, 2015; and 14 WHEREAS, the Mayor has proposed, and the City Council has approved, a 2016 Budget and 15 16 2016-2021 Capital Improvement Program; and WHEREAS, additional staff capacity is needed to support the effective and timely 17 implementation of the 2016 transportation projects and programs funded as part of Move 18 19 Seattle; WHEREAS, two new and three revised 2016-2021 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project 20 pages attachments were inadvertently omitted from Council Greensheet 91-1-A-2 which 21 was approved by the City Council to reflect levy spending; NOW, THEREFORE, 22 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS: 23 Section 1. This project funding will be used to install pedestrian improvements as part of SPU's larger Broadview Sewer and Drainage Improvement project. The Broadview sewer system was built in the 1950's and cannot handle the combination of additional flow from the homes and business that have developed since then and the additional storm water that is entering the system from downspouts directly connected to the sewer system as well as additional storm water entering through deteriorated pipes. This area is also lacking conventional sidewalks and would benefit from pedestrian improvements. The overall project goal is to reduce the potential for sewer backups and surface flooding for the Broadview neighborhood.

This project develops a grade separation of the S Lander St. roadway and the Burlington Northern mainline railroad tracks between First Avenue S and Fourth Avenue S. Previously, City staff evaluated traffic conditions and identified an initial design concept. During the preliminary engineering phase of the project, a consultant conducted a Type, Size, and Location study to develop more detailed plans and cost estimates. The project design recommenced in November of 2006, and in January of 2007, survey, geotechnical, and scoping of the design work began. Design was put on hold in 2008 due to lack of funding. The estimated cost to design and construct this project is \$180-\$200 million.
