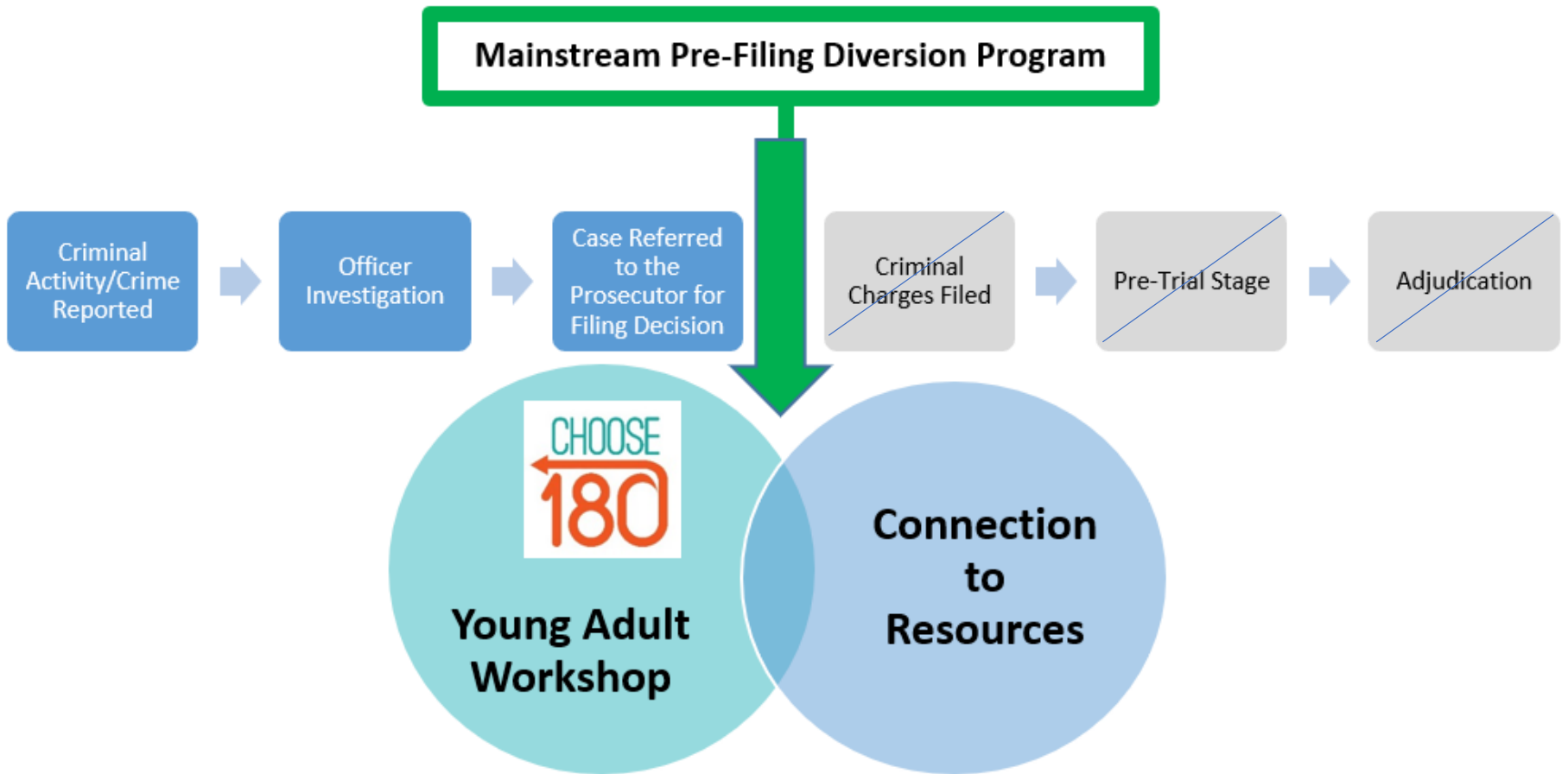

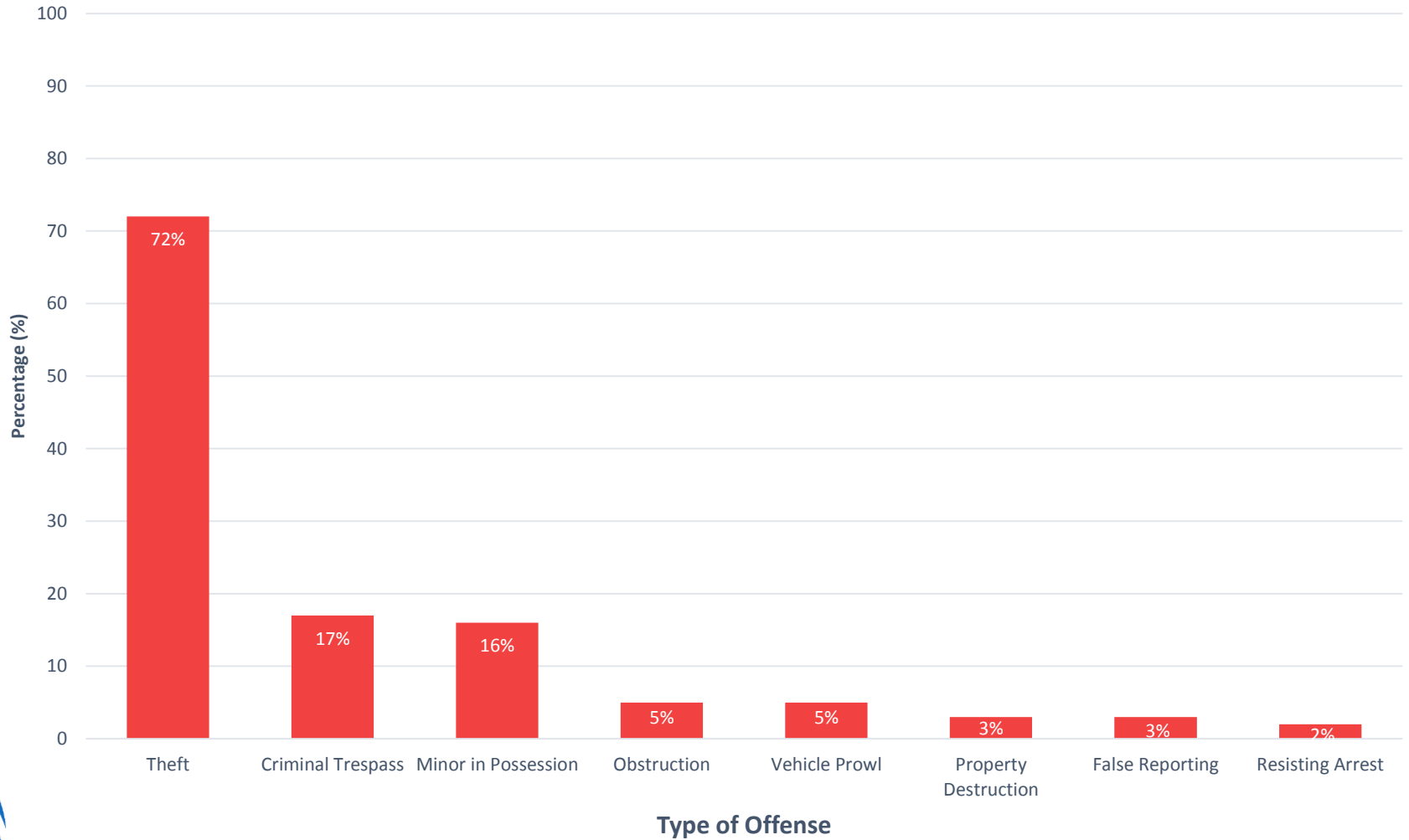

*Total percentage exceeds 100% as some individuals were diverted on more than one charge.



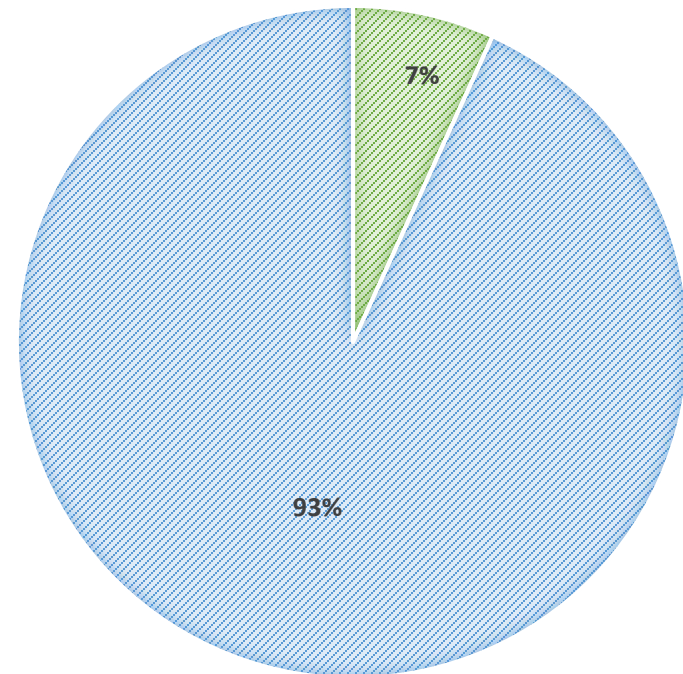


2017 Pilot By The Numbers

- Four workshops – 88 young adults diverted on 98 fileable cases
- 199 young adults on 246 police reports referred as eligible

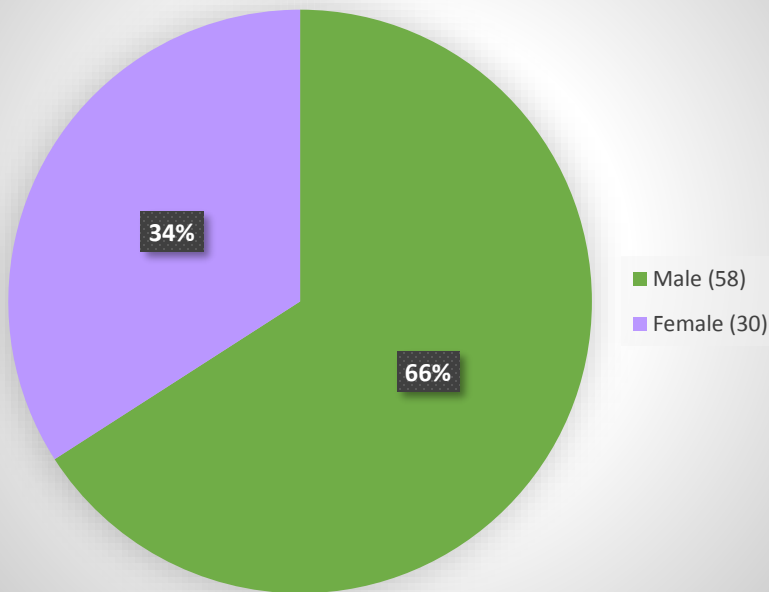
POTENTIAL RECIDIVISM

■ Potential Recidivism (6) ■ No Known Recidivism (82)

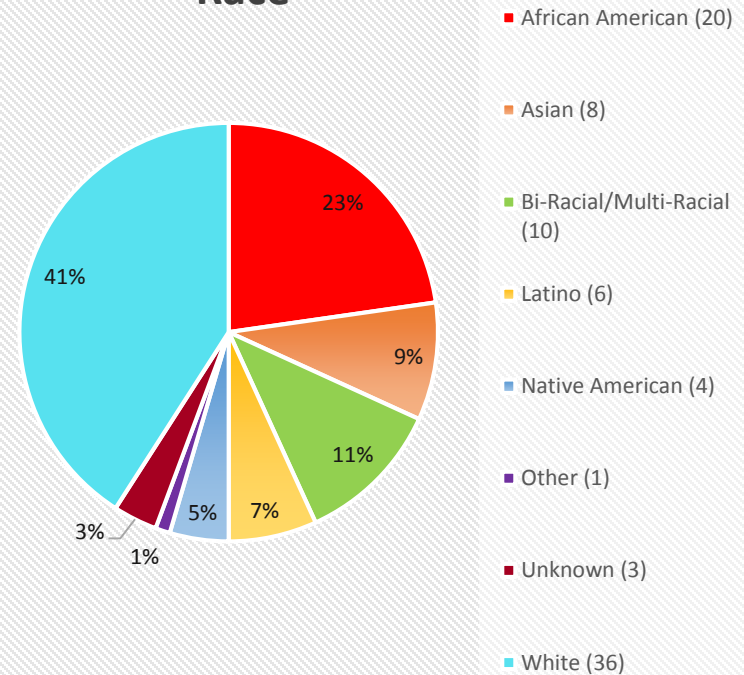


Participants by Gender & Race

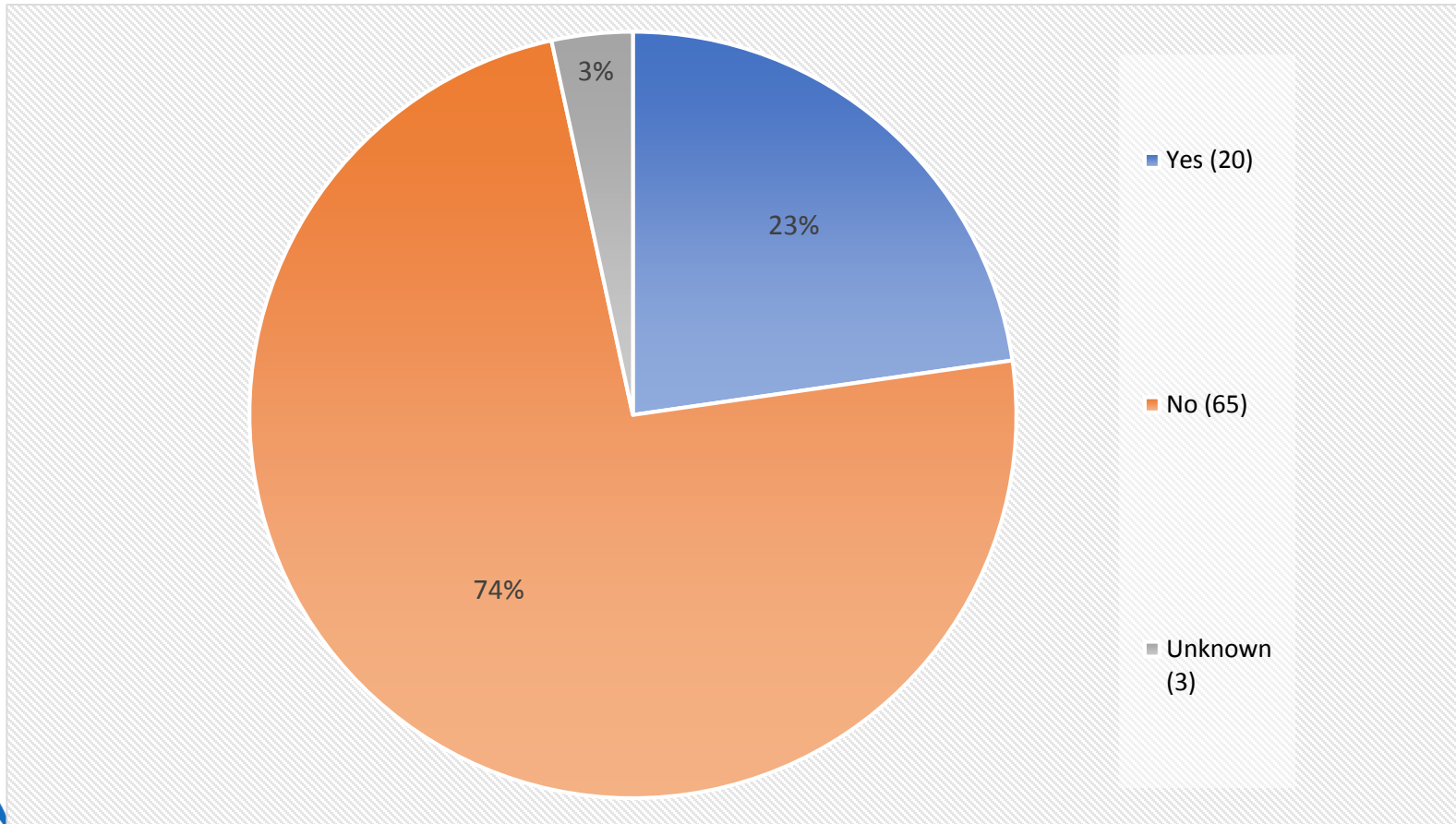
Self-Identified Gender



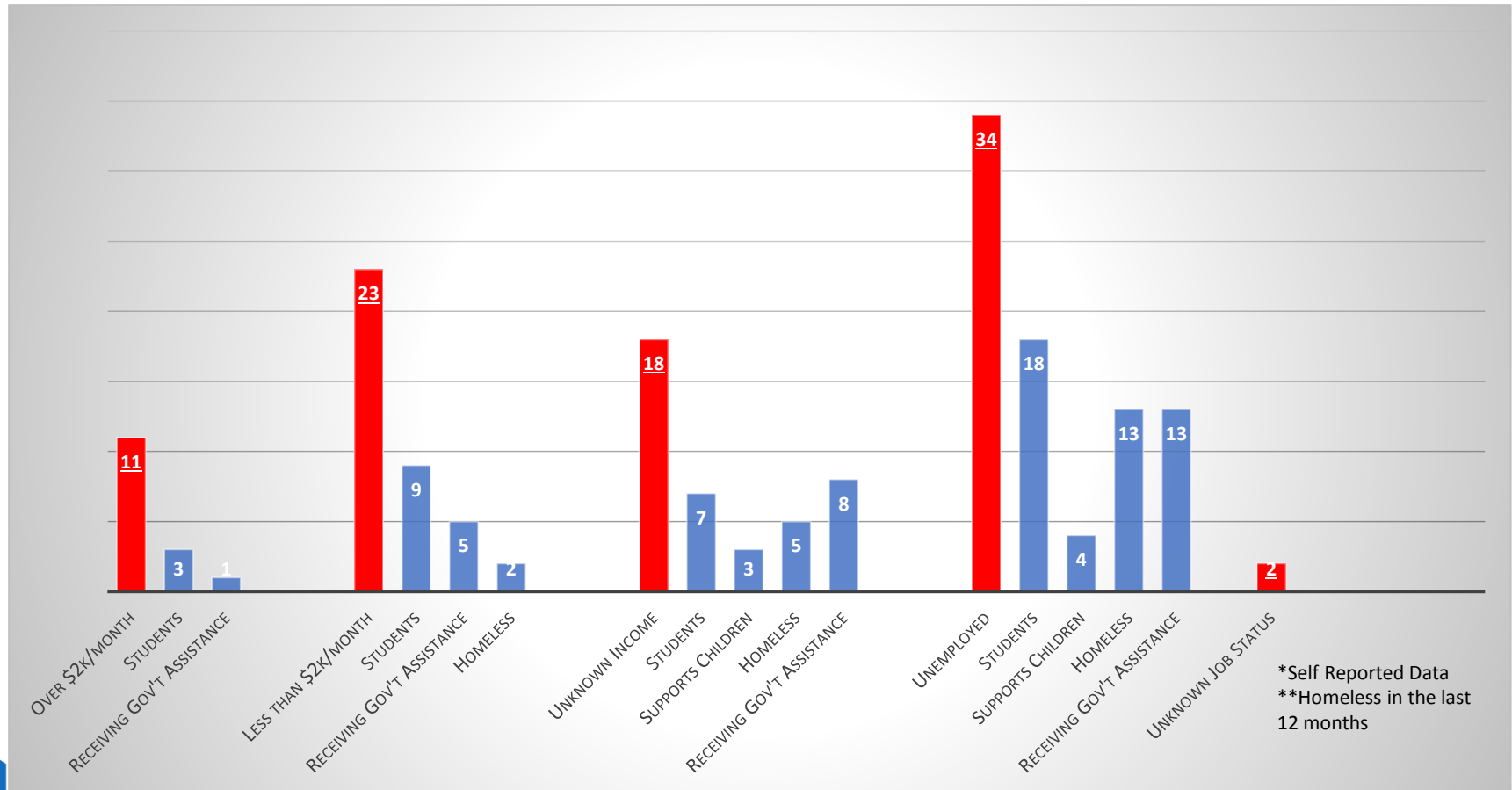
Self-Identified Race



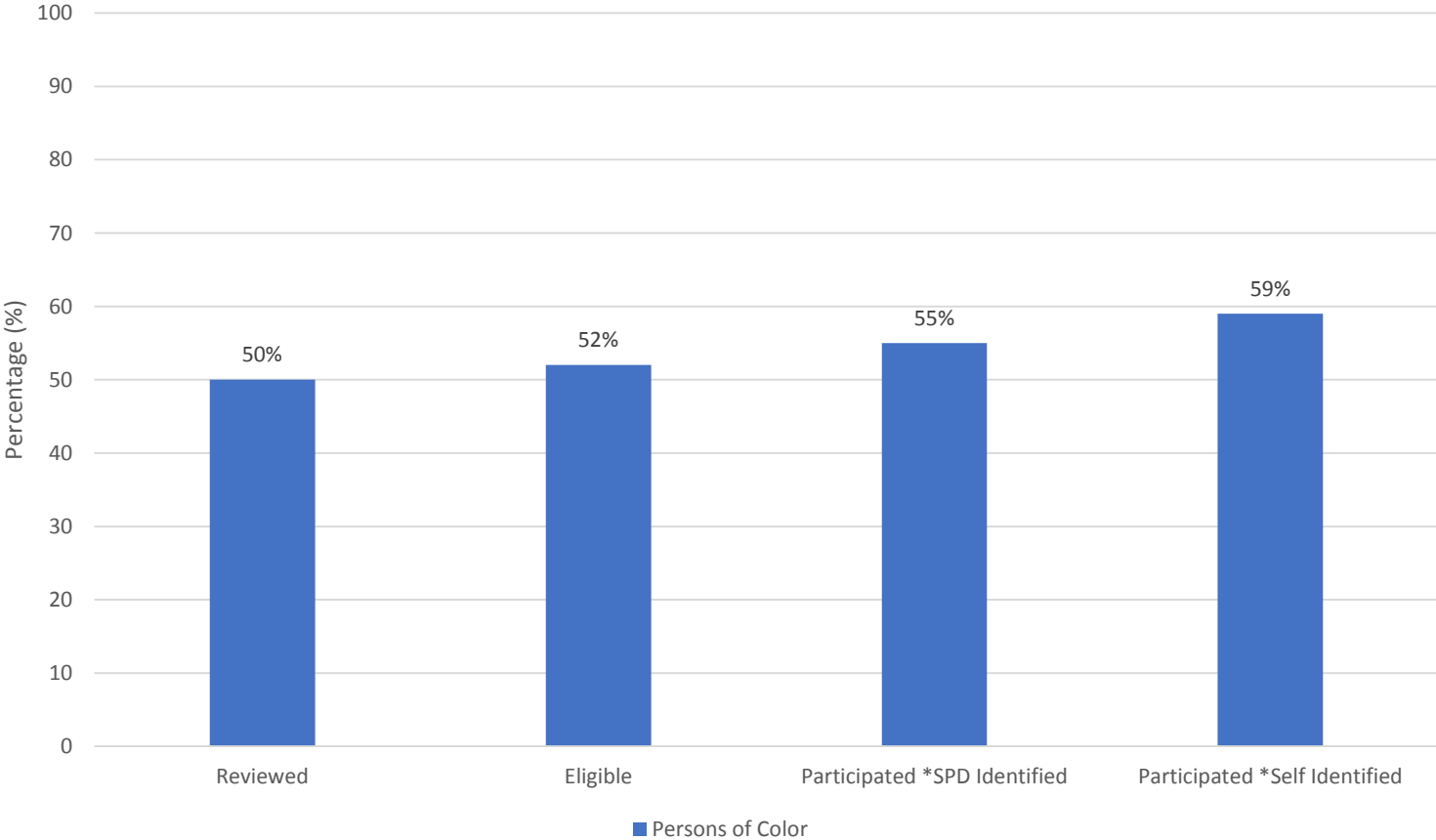
Participants reporting homeless in last 12 months
