

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR – Provide leadership, vision and strategic direction for an organization dedicated to enhancing safety, cleanliness and transportation in the SODO business district. Founded in 2014, the SODO BIA is a relatively new organization with the goal to cultivate relationships and develop collaborative partnerships with BIA business and property owners, elected officials, City of Seattle departments, community organizations and other BIAs to enhance the vitality of SODO. Responsible for the management and oversight of all service contracts consistent with city ordinance and BIA work plan. Serve as primary liaison to the Board of Directors, City of Seattle, community organizations and private sector ratepayers. Oversee all aspects of financial management and reporting in compliance with nonprofit financial standards and the City's Finance and Administrative Services department. Position requires the ability to interact in a professional manner with local businesspeople, property owners, city departments and elected officials.

The U District Partnership/University District Business Improvement Area Seattle, Washington 2012-2014

EVENTS & MARKETING DIRECTOR (Acting Executive Director 2013-2014) – Responsible for the planning, production and promotion of all Partnership operations and events. Primary fundraising event was the University District StreetFair, an annual event attracting over 100,000 people for a two day festival, which raised over \$250,000 for the Partnership. Oversaw transition from a 501c6 to 501c3 organization, and all associated legal requirements. Coordinated board recruitment and development, bylaws revision, and all financial management and reporting. Represented organization to local businesses, University of Washington administrators and City of Seattle departments. Served as BIA Administrator, and managed all operations related to Clean and Safe activities, including, representing the organization on the North Precinct Advisory Committee.

EVENT DIRECTOR – Managed all administrative and organizational aspects of six annual major events which drew participants from all over the state. Responsible for the entire event process, including planning, budgeting, marketing, volunteer recruitment, day of event execution and post event analysis. Instrumental in organizational development for the Chamber, prepared annual Chamber operating budget and developed fundraising strategy.
