

<b>Background:</b> <i>Tim Burgess is the former Mayor of Seattle and former Councilmember from 2007-2017. While on the Council, Tim chaired the Council's Finance Committee.</i>  <i>A Seattle native, Tim has been involved in local community and government matters for 50 years as a radio journalist, Seattle police officer and detective, global anti-poverty worker and small business owner. He chaired his neighborhood community council and served 12 years on the City's Ethics and Elections Commission.</i>  <i>On the Council, Tim spent most of his time on issues related to children. Under his leadership, Seattle became the fourth major U.S. city to fully fund the Nurse Family Partnership, a home visitation program for low-income families that The New York Times calls America's best anti-poverty program. He was the lead architect of the Seattle Preschool Program that will eventually offer high-quality preschool to all of the city's three- and four-year olds.</i>

Appointed by the City Council to serve the remaining months of Mayor Murray's term of office.
- January 2008-September 2017      **Member, Seattle City Council (At-Large)**  
First elected in 2007, reelected in 2011 and again in 2015. Served as Council president in 2014-2015. Chair of the Council's education committee for six years. Also chaired the finance, human services, governance, and public safety committees.
- November 1985-December 2005      **Founder and Co-Owner, The Domain Group**  
A marketing and communications consulting firm serving nonprofit social, child welfare, religious, medical, and humanitarian organizations in the United States and Europe.
- November 1978-November 1985      **Communications/Fundraising Manager, World Concern**  
An international humanitarian relief organization.
- May 1971-November 1978      **Police Officer and Detective, Seattle Police Department**  
Assigned to patrol in West Seattle and Capitol Hill; the Office of the Chief of Police; and as a burglary, theft and fraud detective in Belltown and Queen Anne.

Covered city and county governments, police and fire incidents, and criminal trials related to a police-city government corruption scandal.
