Section 4. The modifications to the 2017-2022 Adopted Capital Improvement Program for the above items are as reflected in Attachments A, B, and C to this ordinance.

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Section 5. The Executive will provide a report to Council detailing the financial operating 1 plan for the Center City Streetcar and the projected performance measures (including ridership, 2 fare box recovery ratio, productivity, fare evasion, and reliability) for the first 6 years of Center 3 City Streetcar operations. The report will include projections for the fund balance of the 4 Streetcar Fund and show how the Executive intends to retire the interfund loan for operating the 5 South Lake Union Streetcar. The report will identify contingency strategies and potential 6 funding sources to address the risk of under collecting future operating revenue. The report will 7 identify contingency strategies and potential funding sources to address the risk that future 8 Federal Transit Agency funds are not included in the federal budget to reimburse the capital 9 construction costs of the project. The report will be submitted in writing to members of the City 10 Council no later than September 30, 2017. 11

Section 6. Any act consistent with the authority of this ordinance taken after its passage and prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.

The project includes procurement of up to ten additional streetcars and design and construction of track and guideway; station shelters and platforms; overhead contact system; traction power substation; storage facility expansion; roadway and drainage; ADA curb ramps; curb space management; and urban streetscape.

This ongoing program implements the Seattle Bicycle Master Plan. Typical improvements may include installing bike lanes and sharrows, bicycle route signing, completing key links in the urban trails network, adding bicycle/pedestrian signals to complete the network, and reconstructing key sections of the trails. The goals of the program are to increase bicycle safety and access, while reducing bicycle crashes. This program includes funding for street improvement and trail construction and is consistent with the focus in the City's Transportation Strategic Plan (TSP) on encouraging walking and biking. The Accelerated Move Seattle Levy - Lid Lift Revenues represent spending that is in excess of available levy funds; consequently, Move Seattle appropriations are reduced in future years so that total Move Seattle funding and expenditures are balanced over the nine years of the levy.

This project improves pedestrian and bicycle safety around schools. The work may include: school zone signing; crosswalk, curb bulb, and sidewalk maintenance; changes to traffic circulation around schools; installation of school zone cameras; school walking route maps; and, bike parking at schools. The base level of transportation funding provides improvements at approximately three to four schools per year. A separate operations and maintenance budget funds safe biking and walking education and outreach campaigns at the schools where improvements are made as well as the maintenance of school zone warning beacons. Operation of school zone cameras is directly funded from the Seattle Police Department budget.
