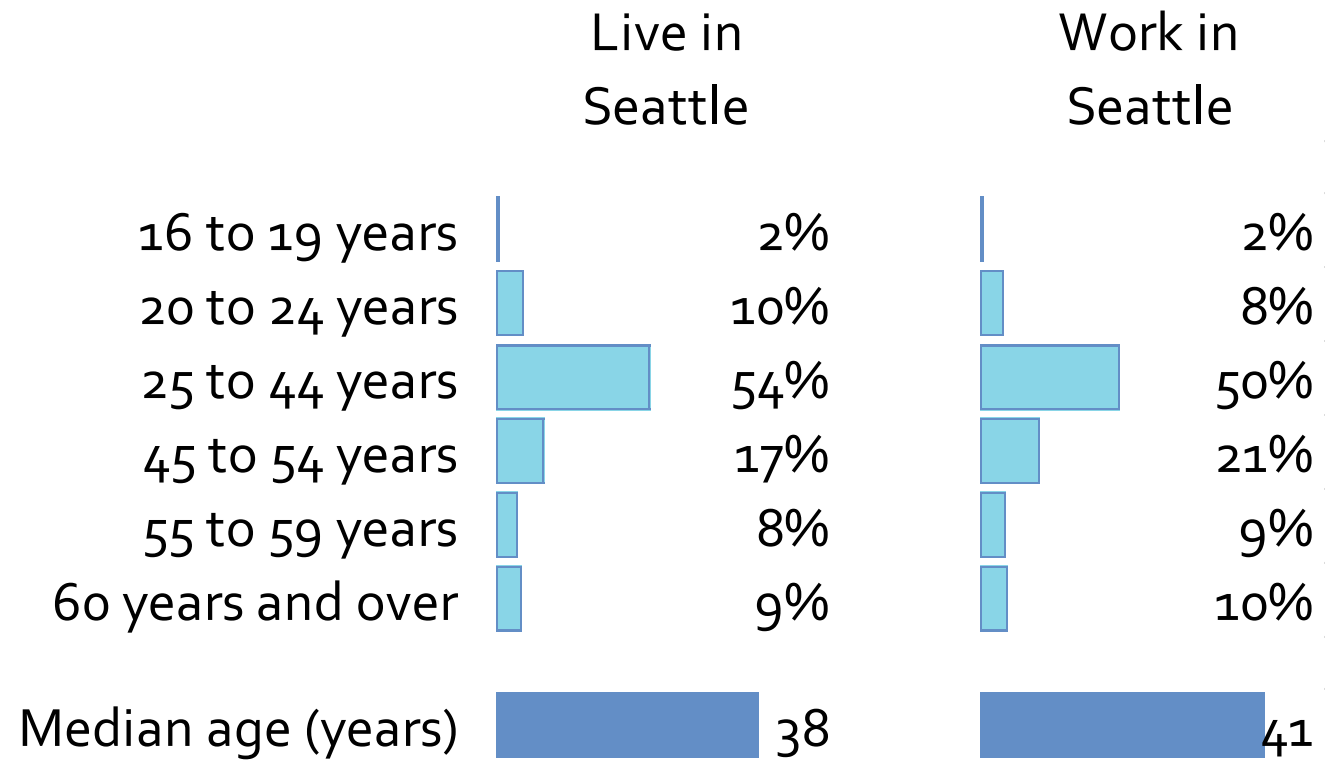

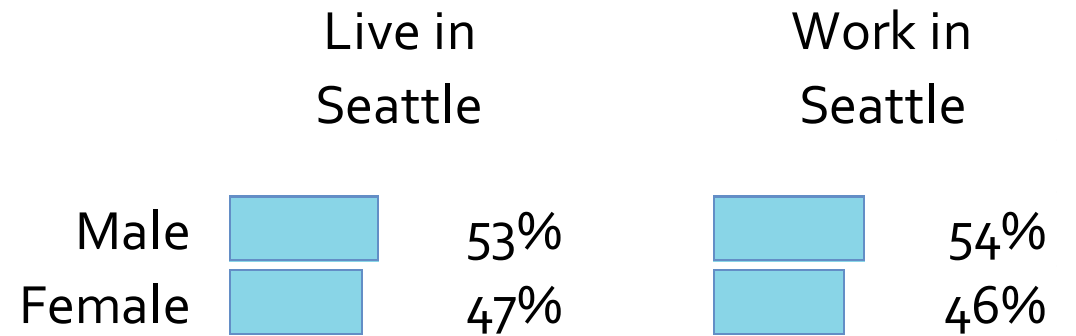

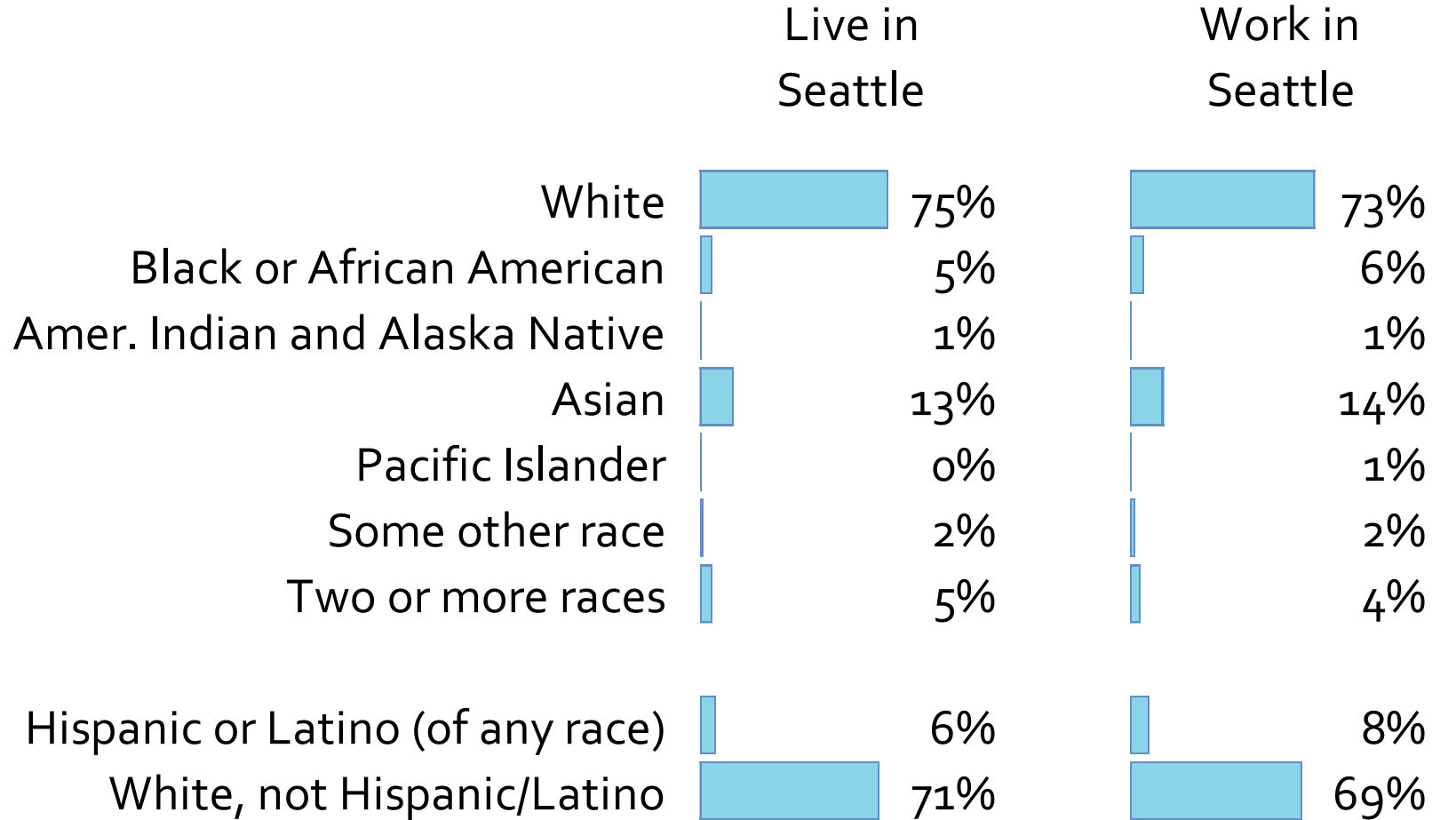

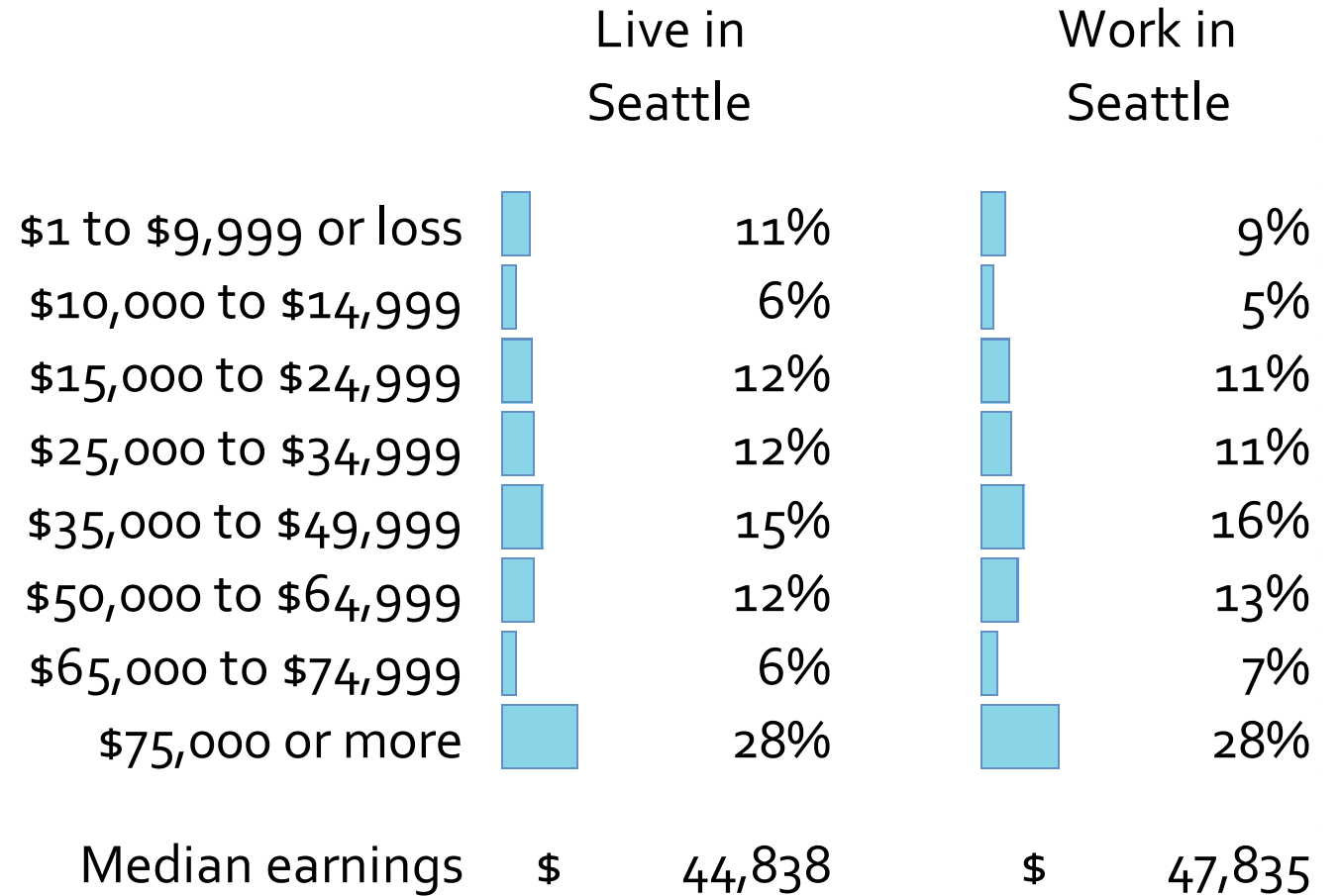

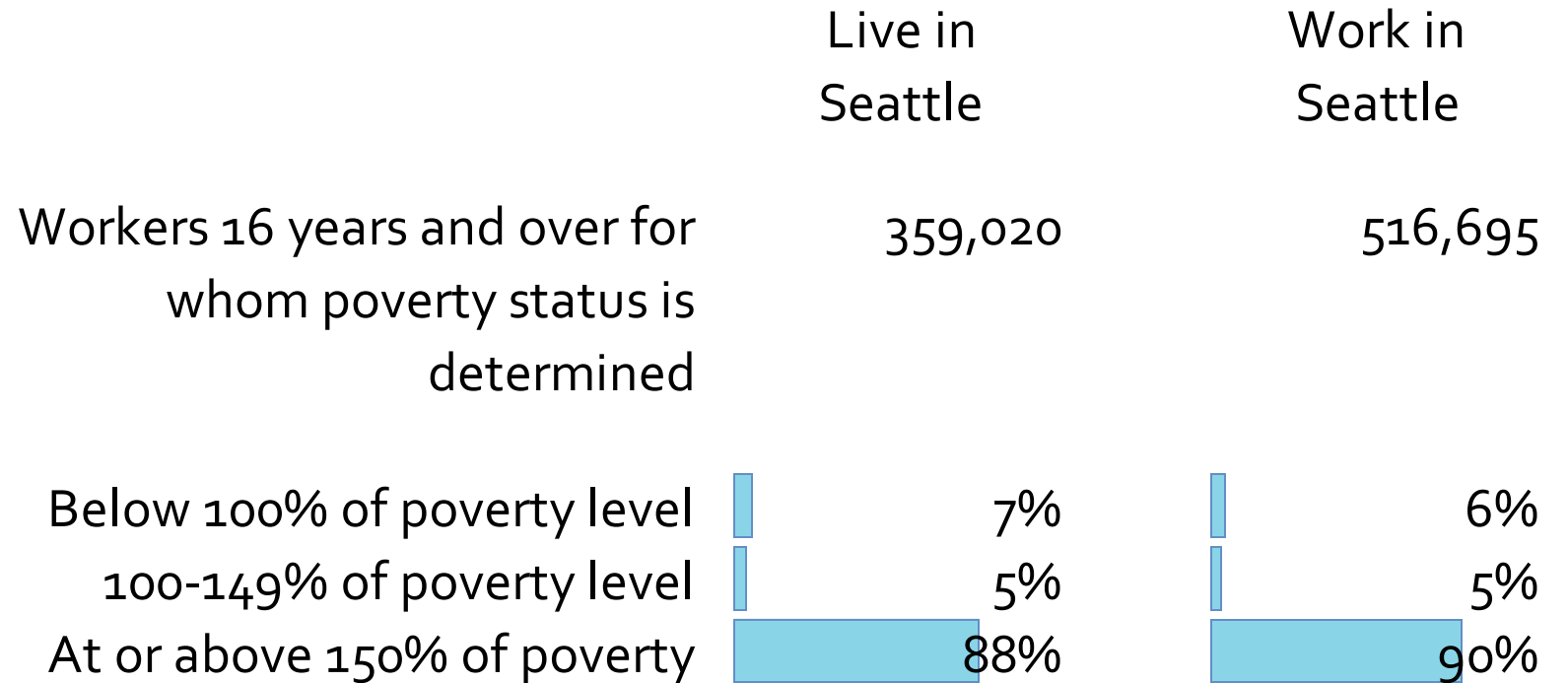

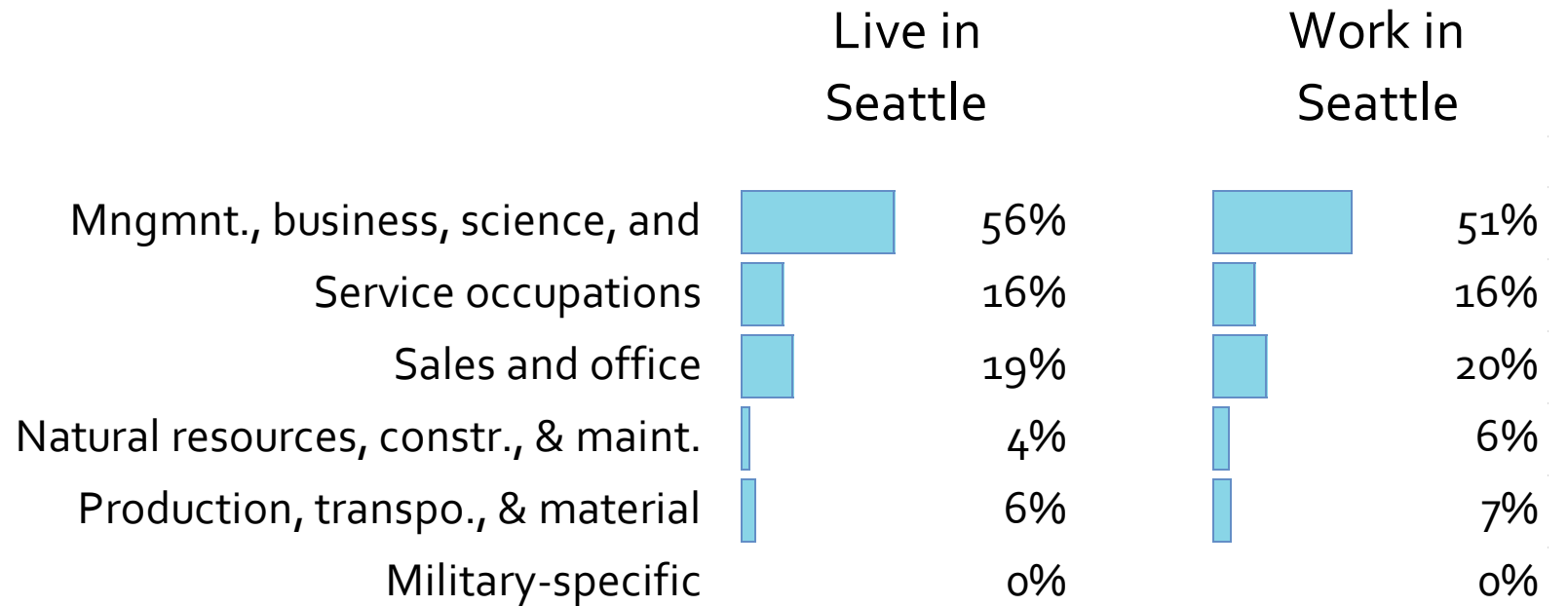

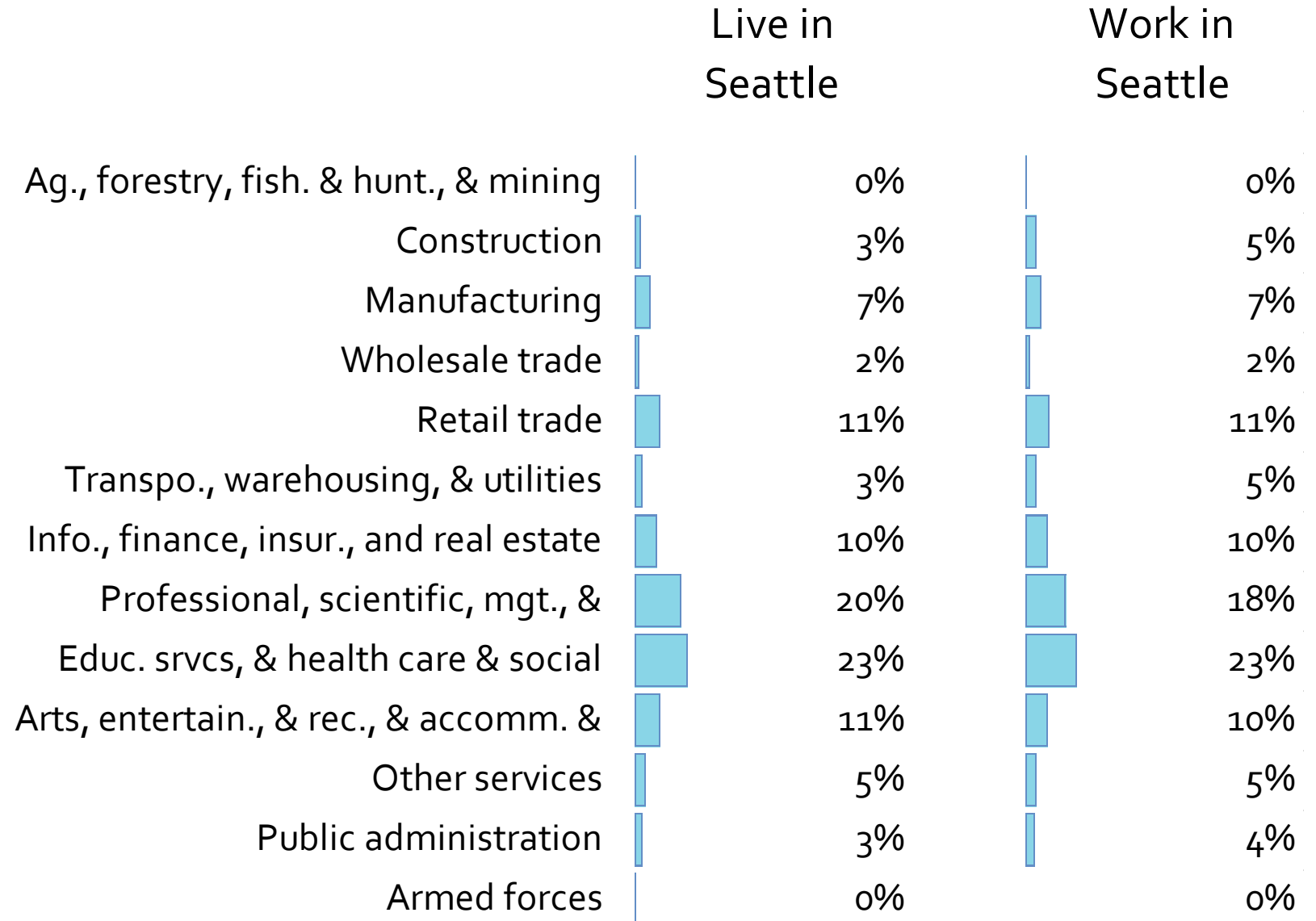

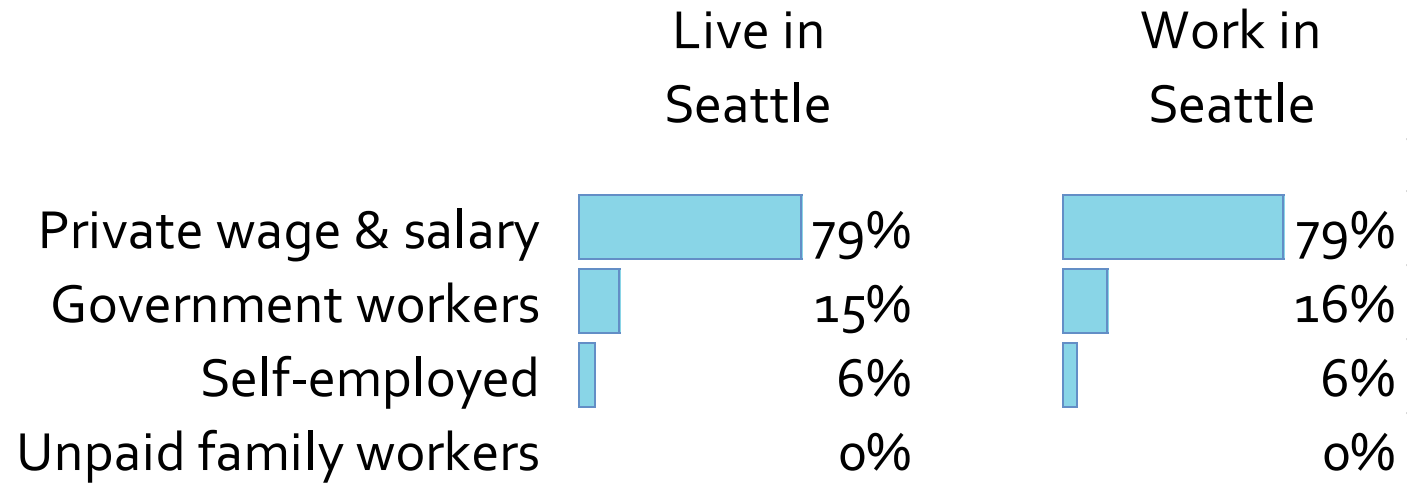

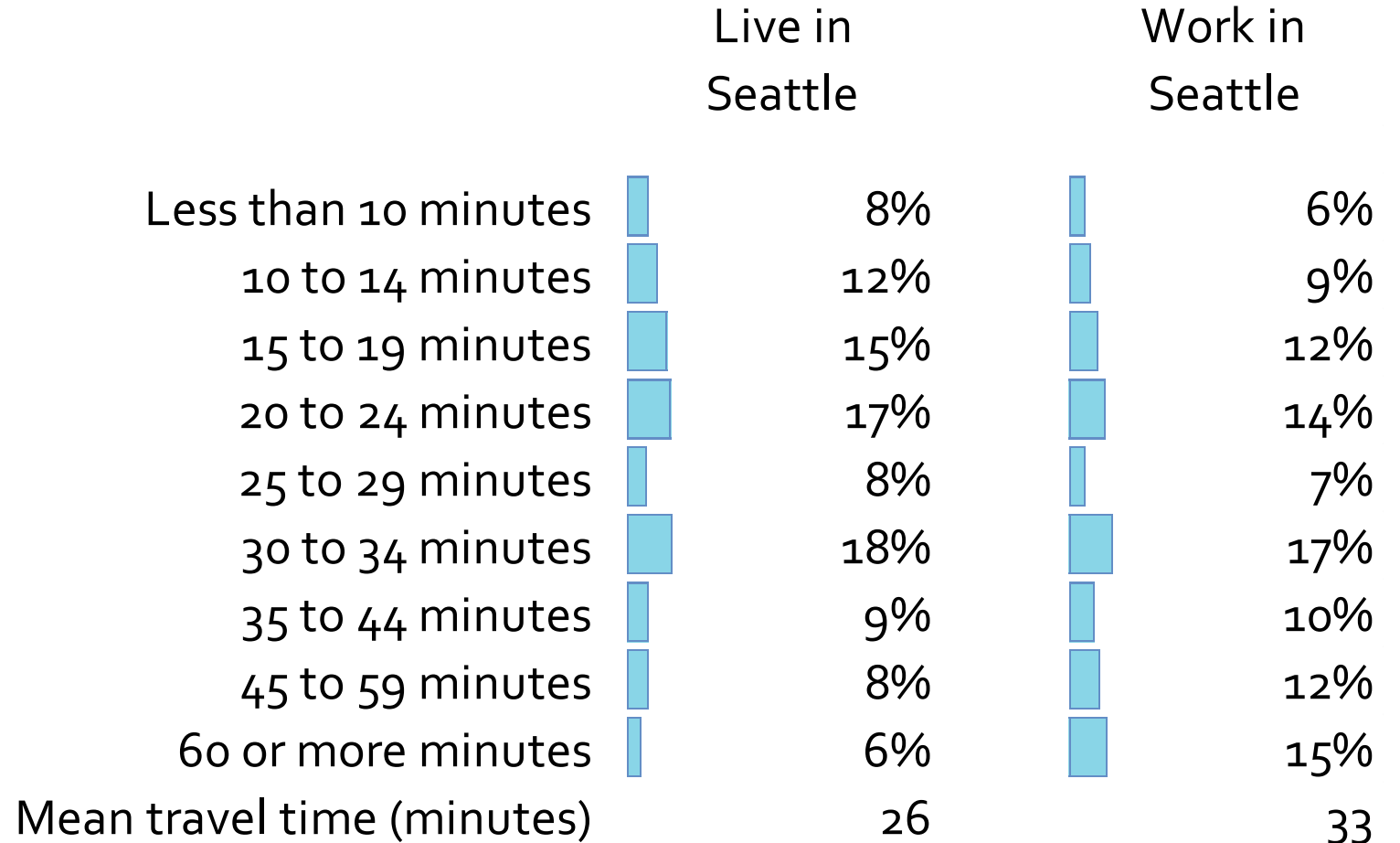

Travel Time to Work

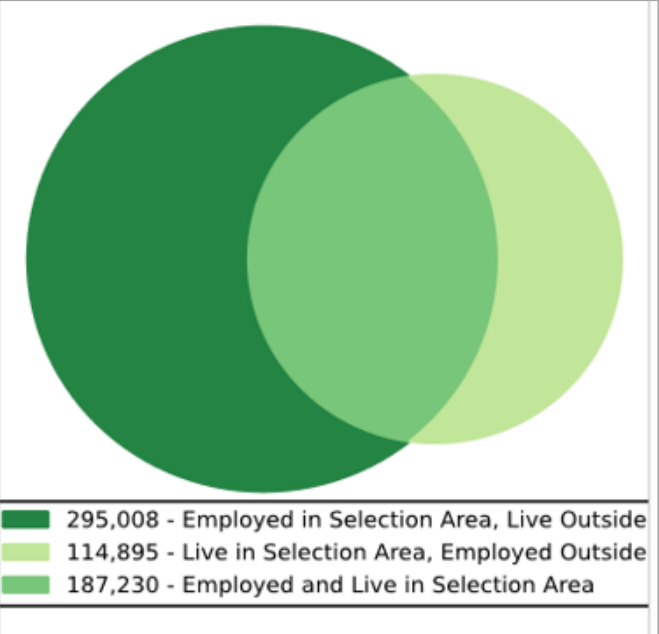
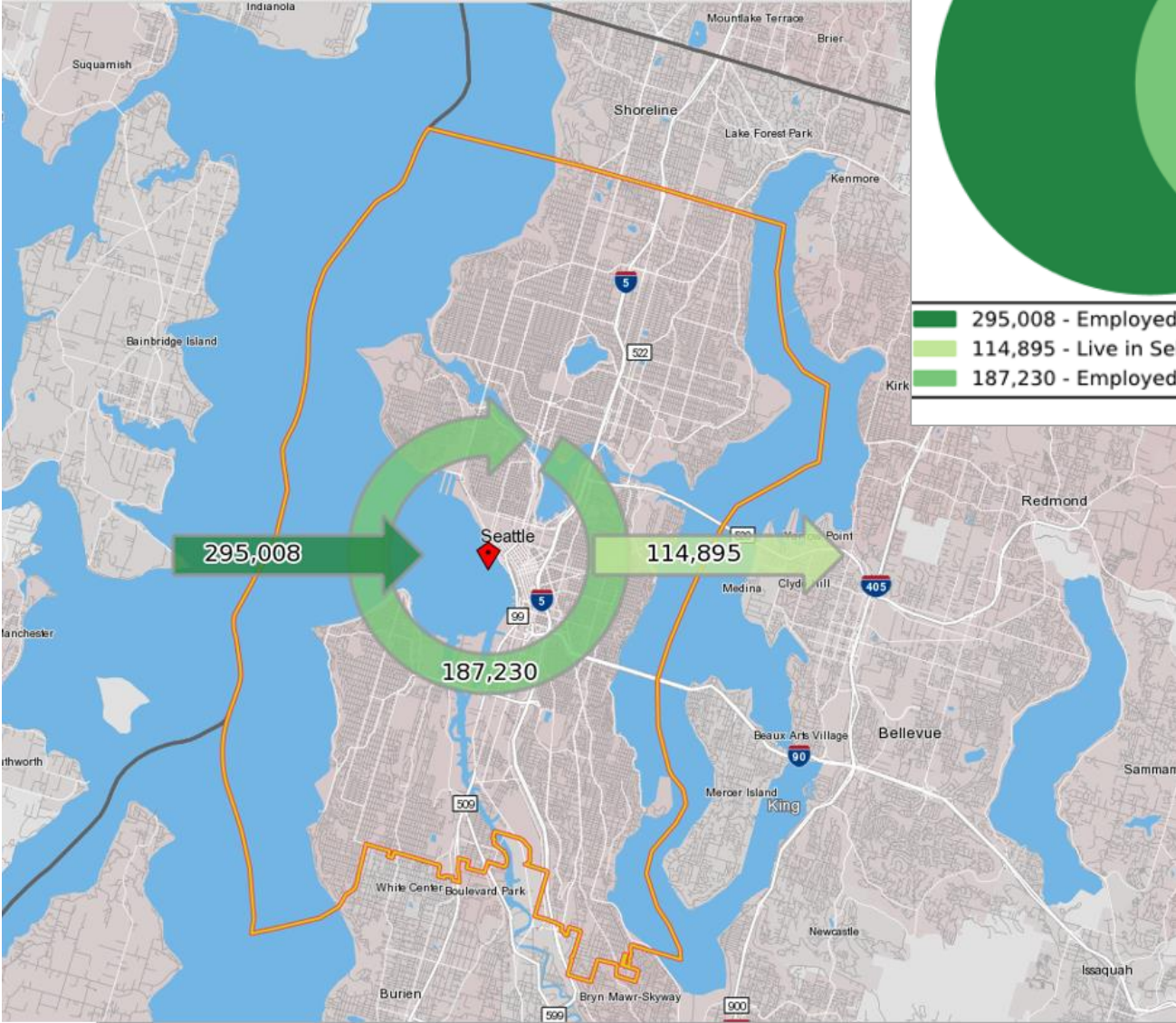

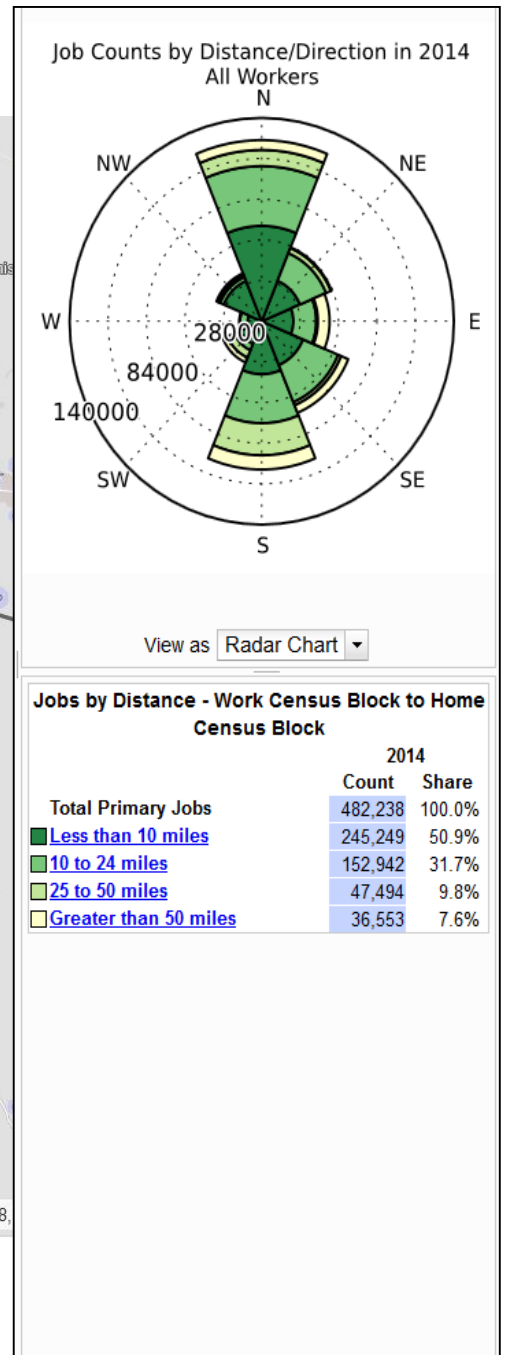
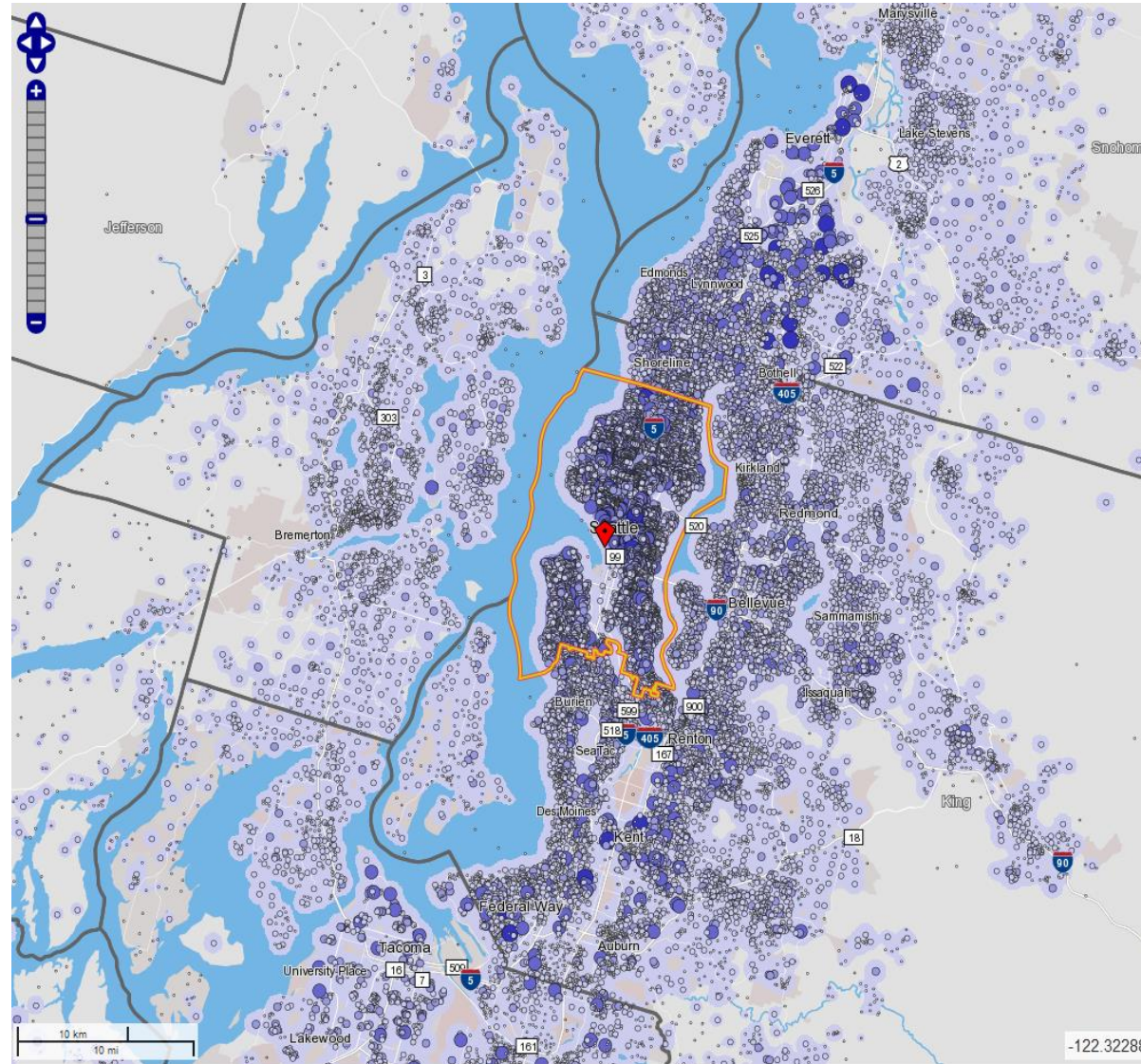
Inflow- Outflow Job Counts

Where Seattle Workers Live

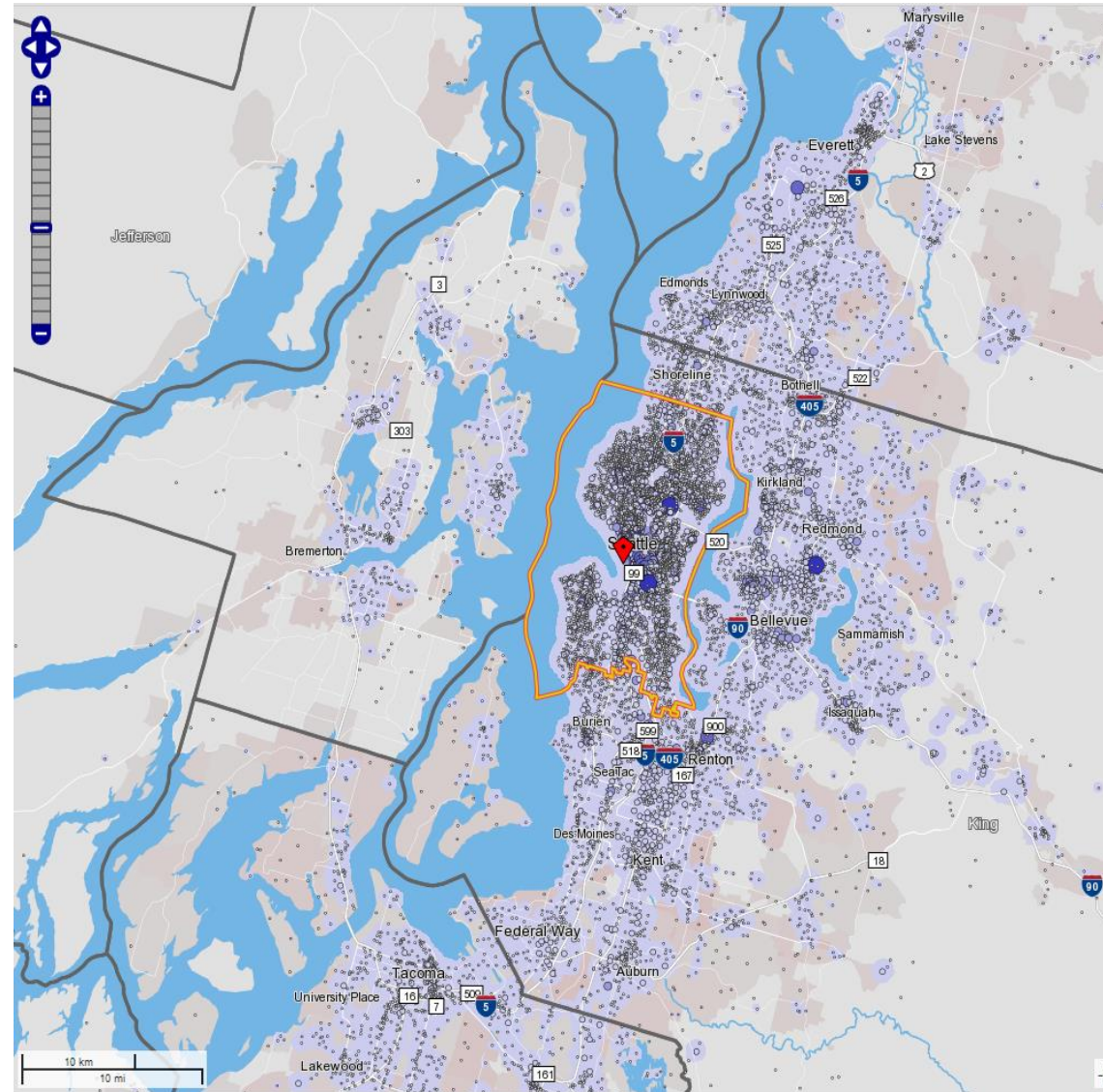

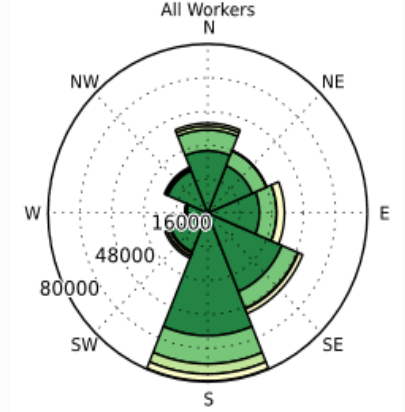
Where Seattle Residents Work

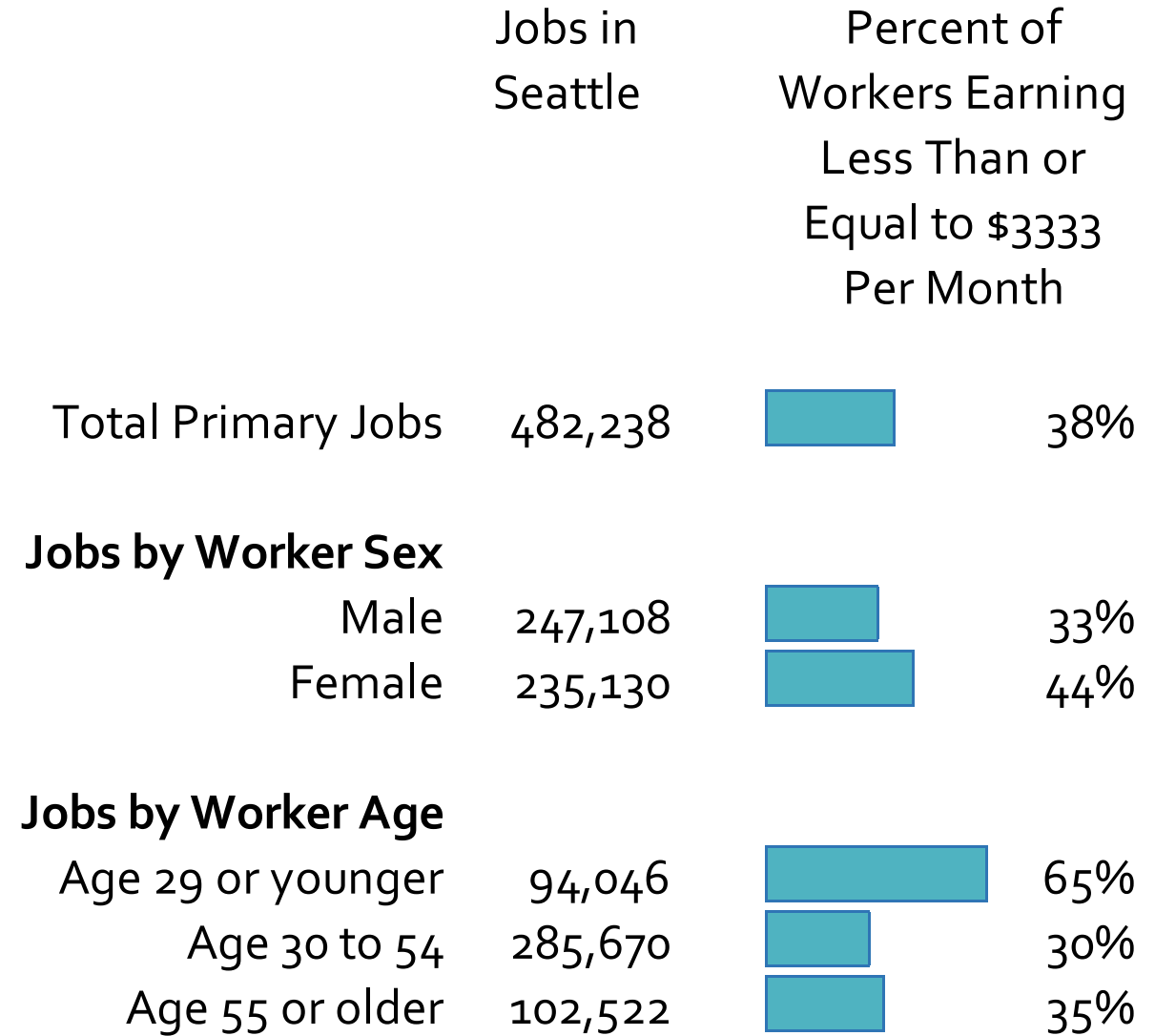

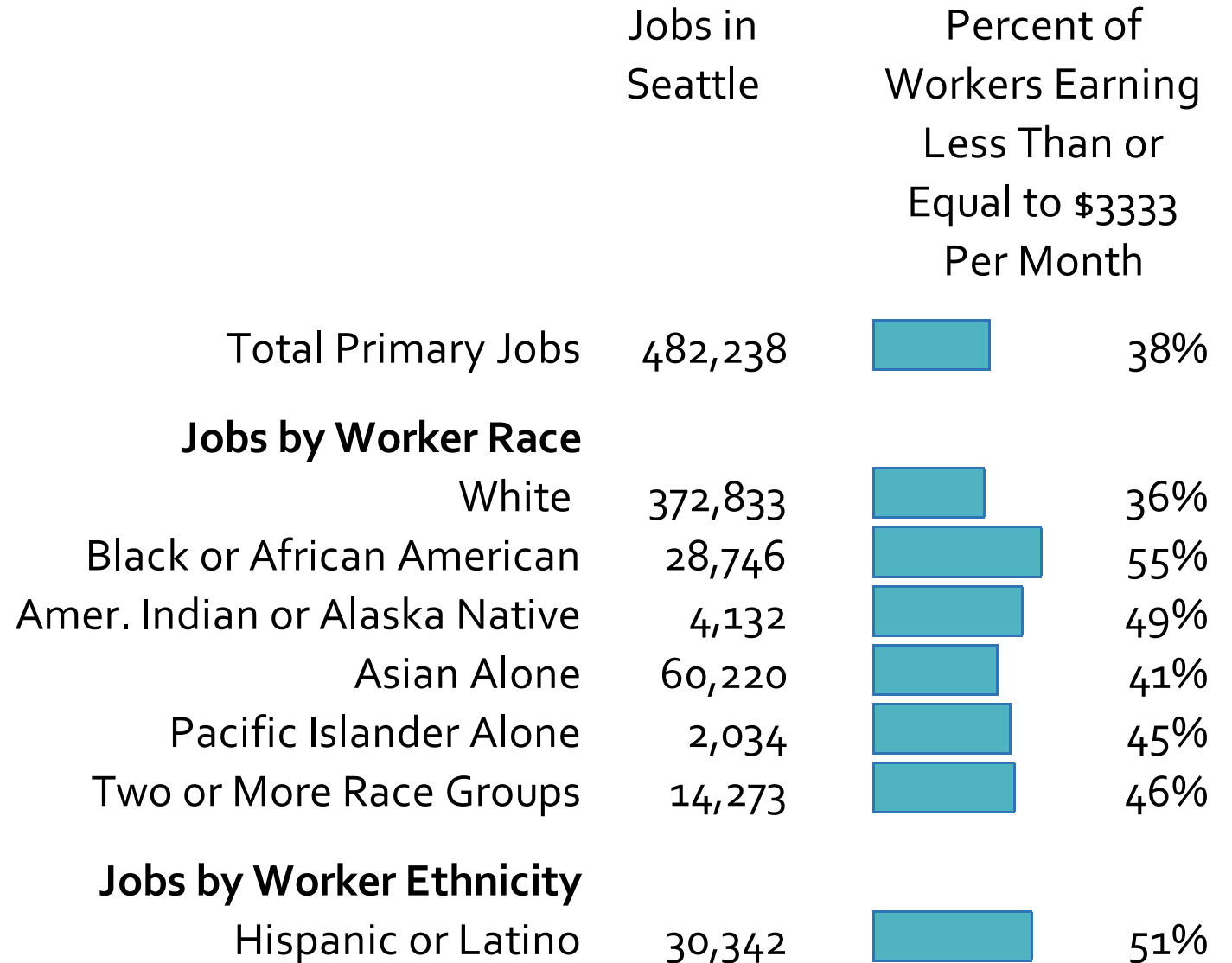

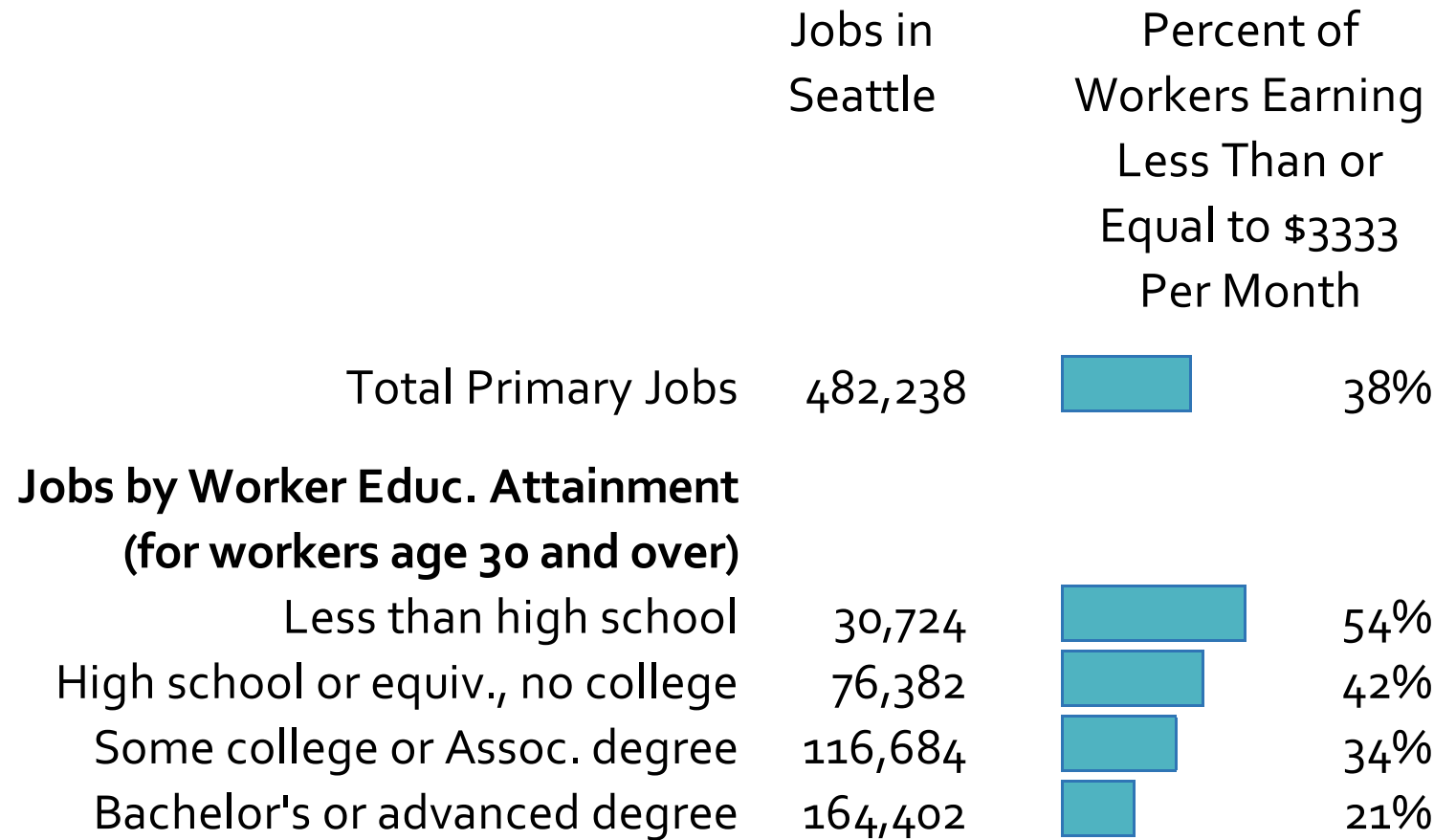

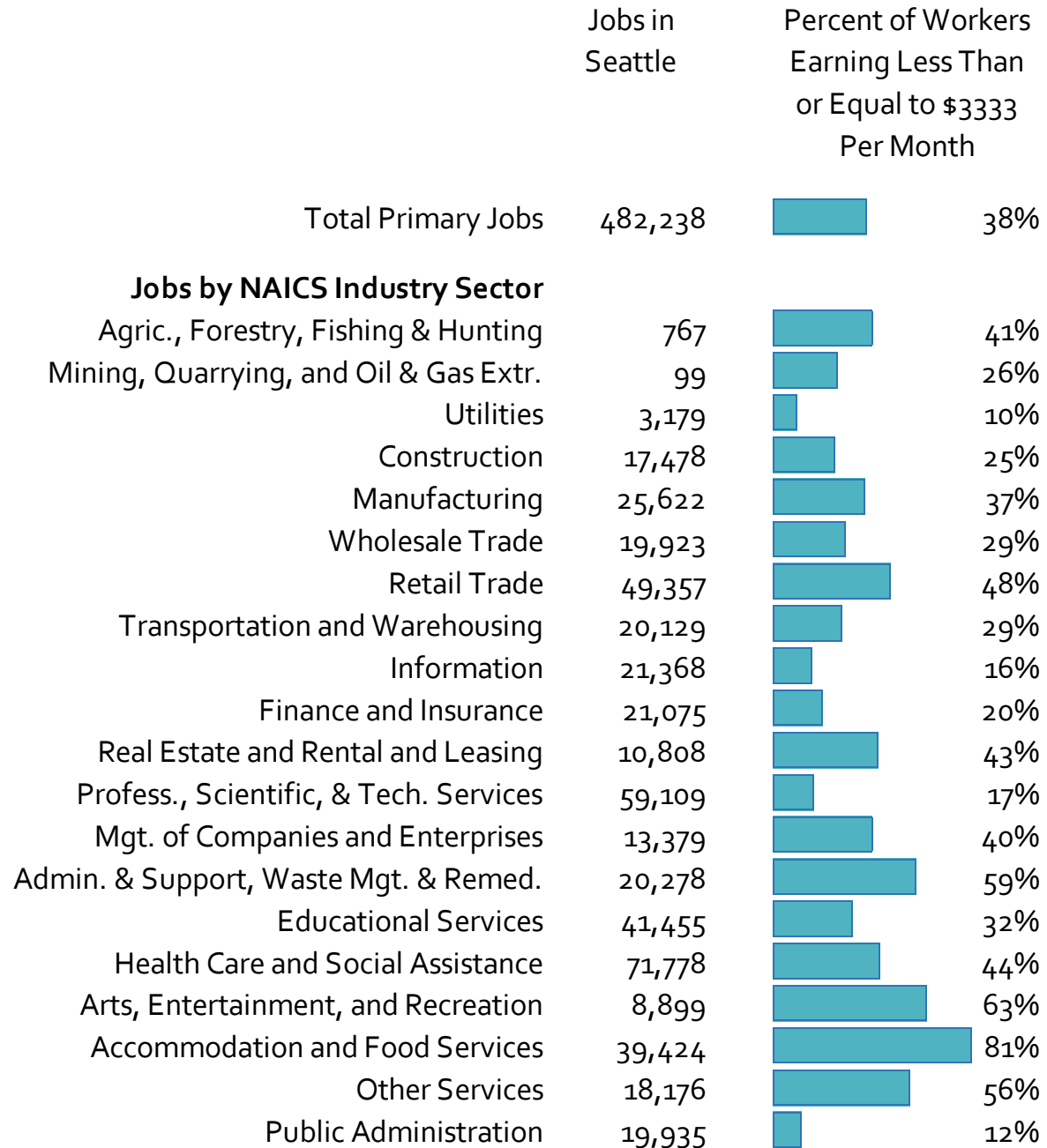

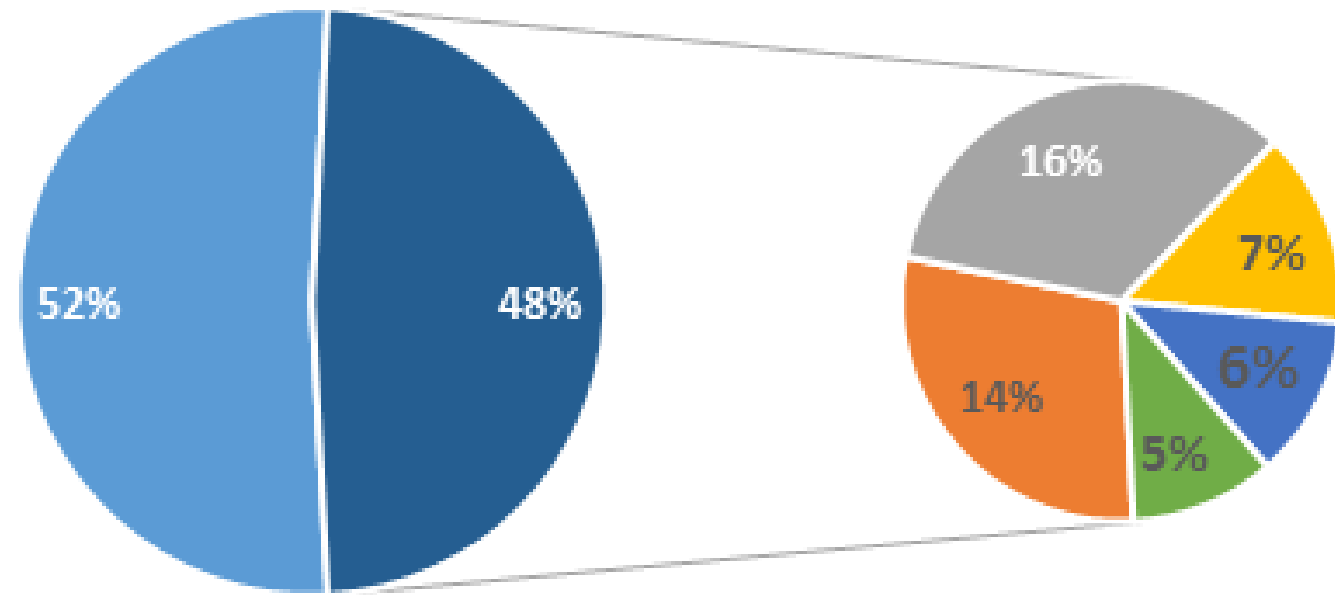
