Ordinance 125604, Ordinance 125807

- Spend FEPP proceeds in accordance with I&E Plan
- Amend the Plan by ordinance
- Seek LOC recommendation for changes requiring Council approval by Ordinance

Addendum No.3



Addendum No.3 is:

- Consistent with voter-approved FEPP levy goals
- Follow latest public health guidance and state mandates
- Balance student, family, and service provider needs





- Effective in current SY 2020-21 (FEPP Year 2)
- Ends August 31, 2021
- If King County remains in Phases 1-3 of Safe Start WA on July 1, 2021 then extends through SY 2021-22 (FEPP Year 3)
- 30-day notification to Chair of Education Committee
- List modifications and assess impact in FEPP Year 2 Annual Report







Investment Area	Excerpts from Addendum No.3
All	 Adapt service-delivery across investment areas to meet public health mandates and recommendations including, but not limited to, social distancing, staff-to-student ratios, and remote learning. Expand FEPP strategies to meet emergent community needs including technology hardware and software, health and safety equipment, provision of basic needs such as nutrition and shelter, and stability for education partners.
Early Learning	 Modify Seattle Preschool Program participant tuition and provider payment model to align with service-delivery adaptions and cost impacts.
Seattle Promise	 Modify Seattle Promise two-year enrollment limit to a two-year equivalency of 90 attempted credits for currently enrolled Seattle Promise scholars who request to enroll part-time or defer enrollment.

SPP: Modified Program Models

In order to meet Public Health guidelines and evolving staffing availability, SPP providers chose to implement one of three models:

- 1. 100% In-Person
- 2. 100% Family Directed (Remote instruction)
- 3. Hybrid (Combination)





Modifications (effective Sept 2020)

- Reduced slot payment by 15% for providers implementing 100% remote programming
- Tuition waived for families attending 100% remote preschool
- Tuition reduced by 50% for families attending in-person or hybrid preschool

Unchanged policy

- Slot payment for in-person and hybrid programming
- Tuition requirement for families above 350% Federal Poverty Level
- Tuition calculated on sliding scale

Promise: Modifications & Current Enrollment

- Remote learning and supports
- Largest cohort to date
- 846 Students enrolled in fall 2020
- 62% Students of color
- 217 students will benefit from the proposed legislation (199 currently enrolled part-time and 18 who have deferred)

Proposed modification & flexibility

- Expand flexibility for part-time and deferred enrollment appeals
- Suspend the two-year limit on enrollment for current scholars

Unchanged policy

- Eligibility requirements
- Max of 90 attempted credits
- Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) expectation
