**1. BILL SUMMARY**

- 1. Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE relating to the financing of the Seattle Streetcar operations; amending Ordinance 122424 to extend an interfund loan from the Move Seattle Levy Fund to the Seattle Streetcar Operations Fund.
- 2. Summary and background of the Legislation:** Ordinance 122424 authorized an interfund loan of up to \$2.2 million to the Seattle Streetcar Operations Fund to be repaid no later than December 31, 2018. Ordinance 123102 amended Ordinance 122424 to increase the loan up to \$3.65 million due to revisions in the financial plan for streetcar operations to reflect updated start-up and ongoing costs, ridership trends, fare increases, and sponsorship assumptions. This legislation extends the term of the loan for one year, to December 31, 2019.

If the interfund loan amount is not extended, South Lake Union expenditures would have to be covered from revenues outside of the Seattle Streetcar Operations Fund, or streetcar service would have to be suspended.
