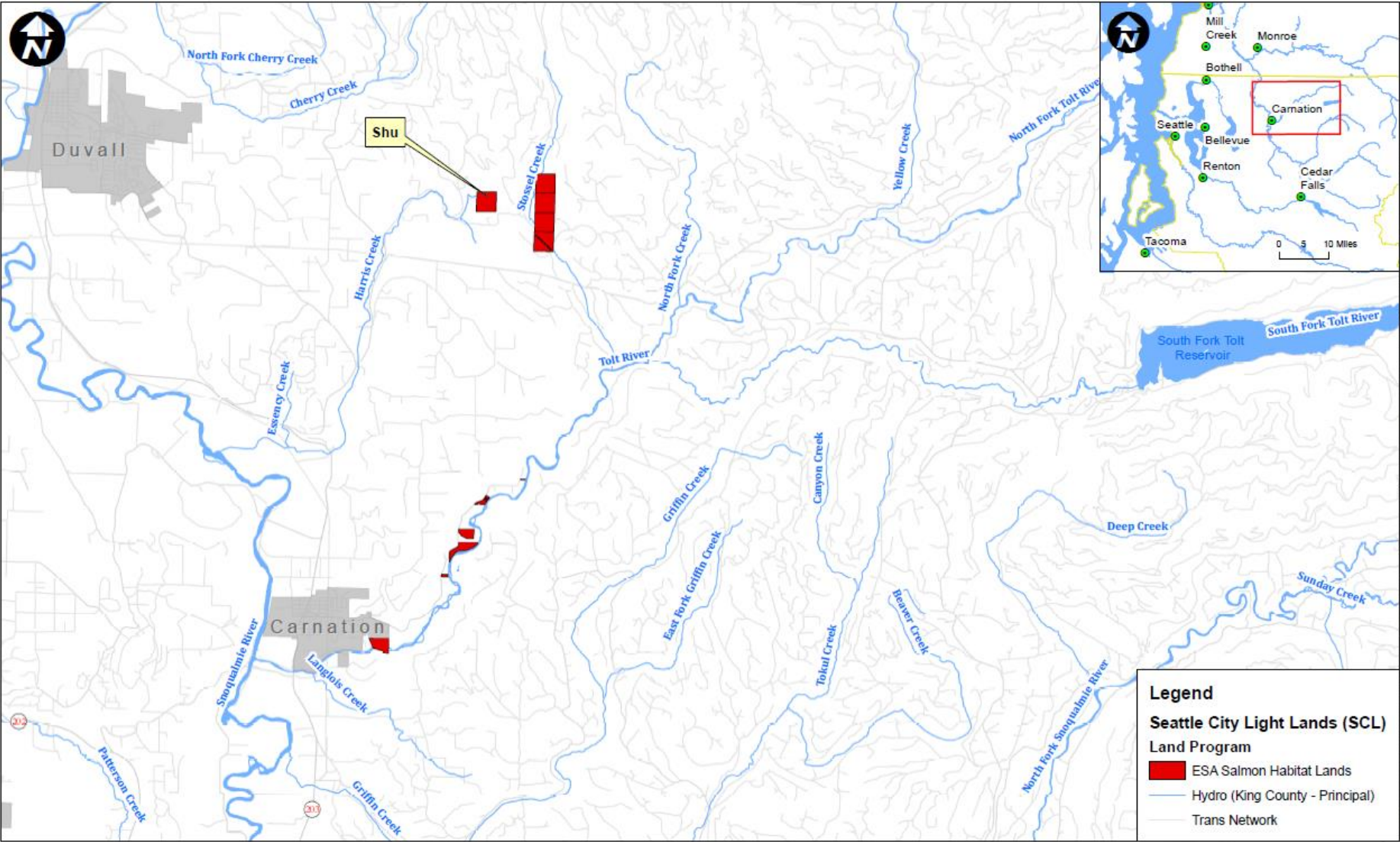
# 2018 ESA DEED ACCEPTANCE ORDINANCE HIGHLIGHTS

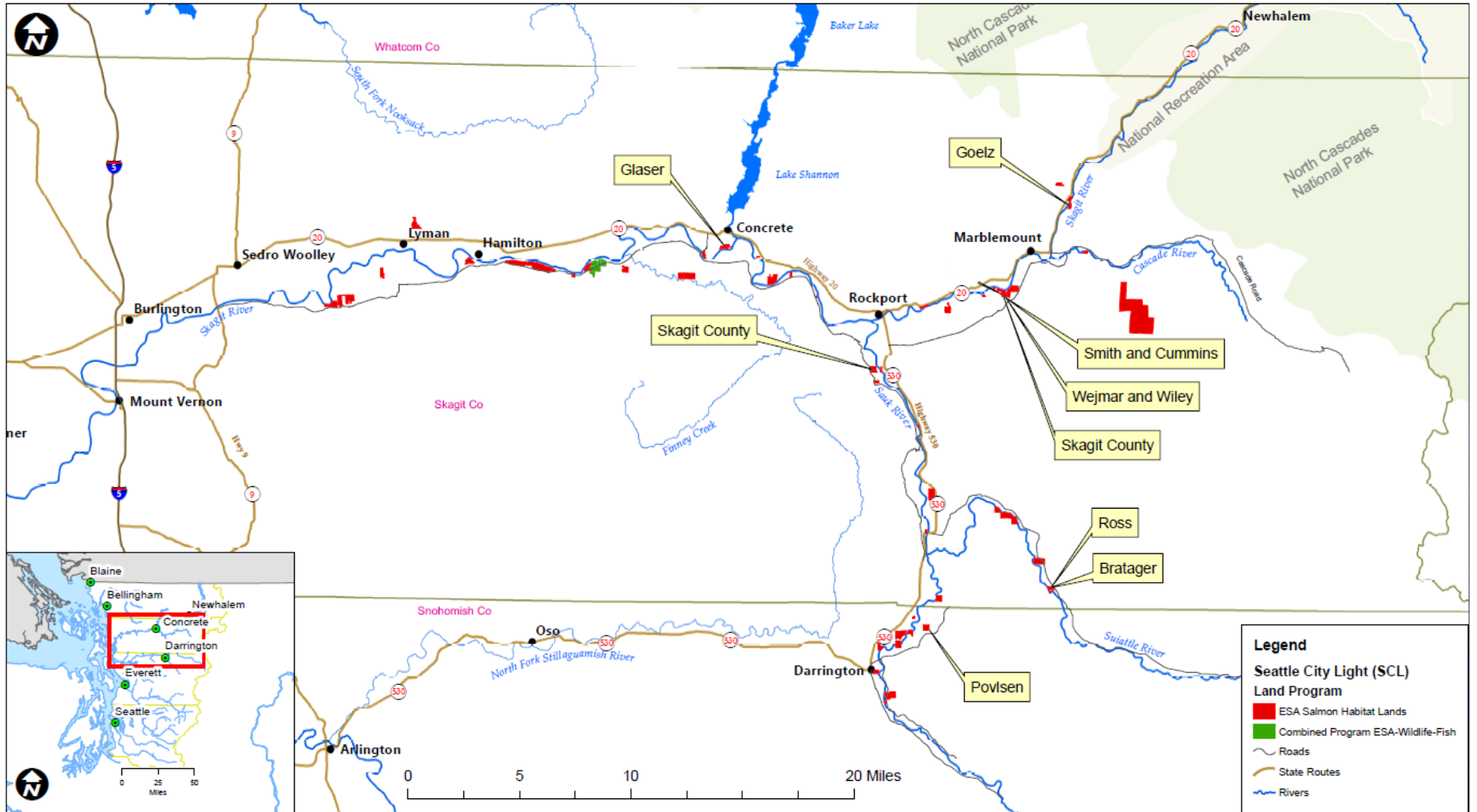

- Ten properties purchased in 2018 to protect spawning and rearing habitat for chinook, steelhead and bull trout
- One each in King and Snohomish Counties, 8 in Skagit County
- Properties located in the Tolt (part of the Snohomish River), Sauk, and Skagit River watersheds totaling over 150 acres
- Funding included \$299,000 from the Salmon Recovery Funding Board
