




Public Safety Model


Care and Presence Model

Resetting Rider Expectations

- Updated Code of Conduct on all buses, refreshed with visuals and clear language to prioritize what matters most to operators and riders.
- Metro's fare education campaign reminds riders that fares help keep transit moving and that we offer free or reduced fares for those who qualify based on ability, age, or income.
- Fare Inspection and Enforcement returns to uphold transit's fare collection in a safe, equitable way.
