

Jay has been a visiting Lecturer at the University of Washington School of Law and has published and spoken extensively on issues in public finance. Jay has a B.A. from Amherst College and a J.D. from Harvard Law School. Since 2013, Jay has served as a Trustee on the Washington State Board for Community & Technical Colleges.
