Until this permit expires, is modified, or revoked, Permittees that have properly obtained coverage under this permit are authorized to discharge to waters of the state in accordance with the special and general conditions which follow.

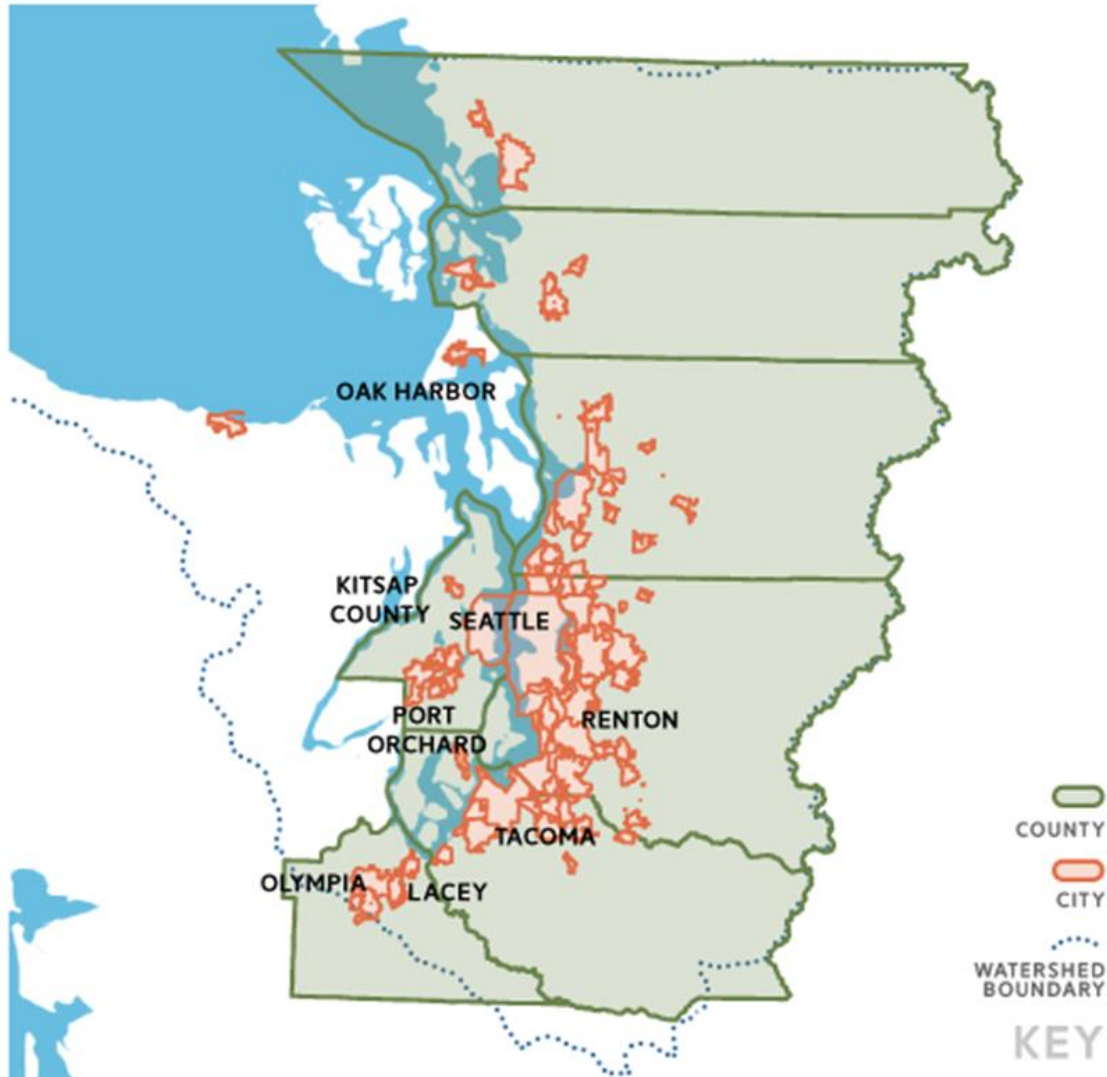
Low-impact Development

- Low-impact development (LID) is an alternative to sending stormwater runoff directly into waterways like Puget Sound.
- Incorporates natural drainage solutions into development
- Uses strategies that collect and filter rainfall and protect people from pollution and flooding.



Nature's Scorecard

How are we doing?



- 15%** failed to meet the permit requirement
- 38%** barely updated, making only minor changes
- 47%** made updates to truly improve their code

- Over 50% of Puget Sound municipalities missed the mark
- 8 municipalities went above and beyond ('Green Stars')
