1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation to execute and accept from the Washington State Department of Natural Resources on behalf of the City of Seattle Waterway Permits for Waterway 3 and a portion of Waterway 4 in Lake Union Park.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation authorizes the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation to execute two Waterway Permits with the State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) for land at Lake Union Park.

Background: The legislation approves two waterway permits. One is for the upland portion of Waterway 4 and replaces a prior permit that the Center for Wooden boats had for the entire waterway with DNR. The portion of waterway 4 proposed for this permit is currently improved as part of Lake Union Park and has been used in that capacity since the park opened in 2010. The second proposed permit is for Waterway 3 and replaces an expired DNR permit. Both permits have a term of 5 years commencing on July 1, 2015.

There will be no fee for the permit, because the properties will be used for public park purposes.
