Purpose

The proposed legislation:

- Accepts a quit claim deed from King County conveying 2 parcels of property in connection with the South Park Bridge project
- Places under SDOT's jurisdiction
- Lays the property off as right-of-way

South Park Bridge Project

The project was designed to improve traffic safety at the five-legged intersection of 14th Avenue South, Dallas Avenue South, and South Sullivan Street by constructing a new, seismically resilient bridge over the Duwamish Waterway.

South Park Bridge Project -Interlocal Agreement

- Ordinance 123101 passed on September 21, 2009, authorizing the City to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with King County for the purpose of acquiring property for the project.
- The Interlocal Agreement was entered into on June 17, 2010.
- The agreement provided that after the project was constructed, the City and King County would agree on which properties acquired by King County for the project should be transferred to the City.
- The County and the City have now agreed that 2 parcels totaling 81,000 square feet should be transferred to City ownership.
