
WHEREAS, the Council Bills, Resolutions, Clerk Files, and Appointments on the attached list have been in a committee or before the City Council for at least one year; NOW,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THAT:**




