

Mission: to identify and address barriers to shelter and housing and to support safe, affordable, accessible housing options for women and families in Seattle by:

- Advocating for Seattle City Council to increase affordable housing by adding the necessary provisions to the 2025 Budget proposal and supporting other legislation;
- Collaborating with local housing organizations, particularly those focused on women and families, to explore opportunities for partnerships;
- Sharing affordable housing resources with the community through our social media channels




