Mr. Malone founded AEI Music Network Inc. in 1971 and built it into the world's leading multi-national music programming and distribution company before selling it in 2001. Bob is passionate about preserving Seattle's historic architecture, in 1981 he has bought and renovated the Sorrento Hotel. Michael has served on may boards and commissions including PONCHO (patrons of Northwest Charitable Organizations), the University of Washington TYEE Board of Advisors, the Seattle Police Foundation, and the National Council of the National Trust for Historic Preservation. This reappointment represents Mr. Malone's fourth term.

Michael J. Malone has been involved in the development of real estate since the early 1980's. Today operating under Hunters Capital, LLC, Malone is known for his focus on historic preservation and growth in Capitol Hill's Pike Pine Neighborhood.

A Seattle native, Mr. Malone was Chairman of DMX Music, formerly AEI Music Network Inc., a company he founded in 1971. He built AEI Music into a \$150 million, multi-national music programming and distribution company with operations in 38 countries before selling to Liberty Media (LINTA) in 2001. Mr. Malone has been the subject in many national business publications which include Forbes Magazine, Fortune Magazine, Newsweek, The New York Times and received the Entrepreneur of the Year Award from Inc. Magazine in 1994. From 2005-2007 Mr. Malone was on the board of 1 billion dollar capitalized; Take-Two Interactive Software Inc. (TTWO) where he served on the audit committee and subsequently headed a special litigation committee. Mr. Malone is currently on the board of Expeditors International, a 9 billion dollar company where her serves on the audit committee (1999-current).

Always passionate about preserving Seattle's historic architecture, Malone bought and renovated the Sorrento Hotel in 1981. Today, Malone has interest in several hotels, as well as premier restaurants on the West Coast.

Active in the community, Mr. Malone is past president and lifetime trustee of PONCHO (Patrons of Northwest Charitable Organization); past chairman and lifetime member of the University of Washington TYEE Board of Advisors, as well as a Trustee on the University of Washington Foundation. In 1990 Mr. Malone served as the City of Seattle's Arts Commissioner and has also served as the City's Commissioner to the Seattle Center. Currently, Mr. Malone serves on the Seattle Police Foundation as one of the Founding members and past Chairman. Additionally, he serves on the National Council of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, the Northwest African American Museum Board of Directors, as well as the Capitol Hill Housing Board of Directors in Seattle.

Born and raised in Seattle, Mr. Malone graduated from the University of Washington. Along with his wife, Barbara and four daughters, Mr. Malone finds time to enjoy racing vintage cars, fly fishing, squash, skiing, and spending time at his rural ranch in Eastern Washington.
