BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS: 				
11	Section 1. The City Council makes the following legislative findings of fact and				
12	declarations:				
13	A. The Council incorporates by reference the findings of fact contained in Ordinance				
14	126293, with the exception of Section 1(H) of that ordinance.				
15	B. In March 2021, the City Council passed Ordinance 126293, establishing interim				
16	development controls relaxing certain restrictions on the operation of home occupations during				
17	the ongoing COVID-19 civil emergency and adopting a work program for the Seattle				
18	Department of Construction and Inspections, in consultation with the Office of Economic				
19	Development, to develop and propose permanent modification of land use regulations for home				
20	occupations.				
21	C. Although the City has worked to develop permanent regulations, the work has not				
22	been completed and the City Council is unlikely to act upon any proposed permanent				
23	regulations, or for those regulations to be effective, until after the expiration of the interim				
24	development controls on April 21, 2022.				
25	D. If the City Council does not adopt permanent regulations that are effective before the				
26	expiration of the interim development controls, the Seattle Department of Construction and				
27	Inspections would be limited to enforcing restrictions on home occupations that existed prior to				

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1	the pandemic. If this were to occur, home-based small businesses, which have relocated from			
2	storefronts or commercially leased locations due to the decline in commercial activity during the			
3	pandemic, may no longer be able to operate out of their current home locations. This is contrary			
4	to the public interest as described in the findings of fact contained in Ordinance 126293.			
5	E. Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 36.70A.390 authorizes the City to extend the			
6	duration of interim development regulations by ordinance for one or more six-month periods.			
7	Section 2. Section 2 of Ordinance 126293 shall be extended and in effect for a period of			
8	six months from the effective date of this ordinance.			
9	Section 3. Any act relating to the application or enforcement of regulations for home			
10	occupations consistent with the authority of this ordinance, taken after its passage and prior to its			
11	effective date, is ratified and confirmed.			

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1	Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by				
2	the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it				
3	shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.
