1 CITY OF SEATTLE ORDINANCE 126599 2 3 COUNCIL BILL 120339 4 5 AN ORDINANCE relating to grant funds from non-City sources; authorizing the Directors of the Office of Planning and Community Development and the Seattle Department of 6 7 Construction and Inspections to accept a grant and execute related agreements; amending 8 Ordinance 126490, which adopted the 2022 Budget; changing appropriations to various 9 departments; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts. 10 WHEREAS, the Office of Planning and Community Development initiated the 130th and 145th 11 12 station area planning process in the fourth quarter of 2018 to ensure the benefits of future 13 high-capacity transit are equitably distributed and additional investments are equitably 14 leveraged; and 15 WHEREAS, between March 2019 and October 2020, the Office of Planning and Community Development conducted community outreach and engagement to create a community 16 vision for the station area. The outreach and engagement included interviews with 17 18 community organizations and institutions, an online survey, an online and in-person open 19 house, an online and in-person community workshop, and four online community 20 conversations; and 21 WHEREAS, the Office of Planning and Community Development used community input to produce a Draft Plan for the Station Area articulating the community's vision for a 22 23 vibrant, walkable, mixed-use neighborhood surrounding light rail and bus rapid transit stations. The plan was released for public review and comment in March 2021; and 24 25 WHEREAS, Sound Transit is constructing the Lynwood Link Extension, scheduled to begin 26 revenue service in 2024, that includes the Shoreline South station; and

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1	WHEREAS, Sound Transit is designing the SR 522/NE 145th Stride bus rapid transit service
2	that will connect to Link light rail at Shoreline South/148 th and will include a station at
3	NE 145 th Street and 15 th Avenue NE; and
4	WHEREAS, following 17 months of discussions and engagement with jurisdictions and
5	stakeholders, the Sound Transit Board adopted a realignment plan on August 5, 2021,
6	that will serve as a framework for delivering agency system expansions as rapidly as
7	possible. The realignment plan includes an infill station for the Lynwood Link Extension
8	at NE 130th Street to be completed by 2025, and SR 522/NE 145th Stride bus rapid
9	transit service to begin service in 2026; and
10	WHEREAS, the Office of Planning and Community Development staff submitted a grant
11	proposal to the Washington Department of Commerce, Growth Management Services
12	(GMS) unit to support Transit-Oriented Development and Implementation (TODI)
13	planning and was awarded \$250,000 to carry out this work from July 1, 2021 through
14	June 30, 2023; and
15	WHEREAS, the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections is responsible for
16	implementing Chapter 23.60A of the Seattle Municipal Code, known as the Shoreline
17	Master Program (SMP); and
18	WHEREAS, Section 23.60A.027 of the Seattle Municipal Code provides for the development of
19	a mitigation program that improves the implementation of the Shoreline Master Program
20	establishing a defensible and transparent permitting tool by which both the impacts to
21	shoreline ecological functions and the mitigation required to offset these impacts can be
22	measured; and

1 WHEREAS, the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections staff submitted a grant 2 proposal to the Washington Department of Ecology, Shorelands and Environmental 3 Assistance Program, to support shoreline planning and planning related efforts that, in part, advance local shoreline planning priorities and improve the implementation of 4 5 SMPs, and was awarded \$50,730 to carry out mitigation planning from January 1, 2022, 6 through June 30, 2023; NOW, THEREFORE, 7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS: 8 Section 1. The Director of the Office of Planning and Community Development, or the 9 Director's designee, is authorized to accept non-City funding from the Washington Department 10 of Commerce, Growth Management Services (GMS) unit, and to execute, deliver, and perform 11 on behalf of The City of Seattle agreements reasonably deemed necessary for the receipt of GMS 12 funds in an amount up to \$250,000 to support Transit-Oriented Development and 13 Implementation (TODI) planning. 14 Section 2. The Director of the Seattle Department of Construction and Inspections, or the 15 Director's designee, is authorized to accept non-City funding from the Washington State 16 Department of Ecology (DOE) and to execute, deliver, and perform on behalf of the City of 17 Settle, agreements reasonably deemed necessary for the receipt of DOE funds in an amount up to 18 \$50,730 to support the Shoreline Master Program. 19 Section 3. Contingent upon the execution of the grant or other funding agreement and 20 receipt of the grant funds authorized in Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance, the appropriations for

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the following items in the 2022 Budget are increased as follows:
