Legislation Title: A RESOLUTION affirming the human right to privacy and expressing a desire that the policies and products of the City's privacy initiative be consistent with the right to privacy as described in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the applicable international human rights framework.								
Summary and background of the Legislation: The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 1948 and endorsed by the United States, states that "No one shall be subjected to arbitrary interference with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to attacks upon his honour and reputation. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such interference or attacks."								
In 2012, the City Council adopted Resolution 31420 proclaiming Seattle to be a Human Rights City, and endorsing the human rights contained in the UDHR. The City also began a privacy initiative in 2014 intended to strengthen the City's privacy practices.								
This resolution affirms the human right to privacy as described in the UDHR, and expresses the City Council's desire that any policies or products of the privacy initiative be consistent with the UDHR's right to privacy.
