

- Fish health
- Fry production
- Smolt evaluations
- Adult returns at the Locks
- Broodstock sampling
- Sockeye fecundity, age & size









Summary of Legislation

 Authorizes the Director of SPU to enter into a five-year interagency agreement with WDFW to provide monitoring and evaluation activities for the hatchery program







Annual Monitoring and Evaluation Agreements

<u>Previously</u>

- Average annual spending = \$125k
- 4 or 5 contracts every 2 years

Under this agreement

- Average annual spending= \$125k
- 1 contract every 5 years
- Detailed, easy to execute Task Orders
