What is Low Impact Development?

- Stormwater and land use management strategies that mimic natural hydrology
- **Examples:** reduced impervious surface, bioretention, rain gardens, preservation of native vegetation

Why are we proposing this legislation?



- New requirement of the City's municipal stormwater permit, issued by the Department of Ecology
- City departments required to review development-related codes and rules to encourage LID



DPD - Changes to the Land Use Code

Proposed changes add flexibility and remove barriers in order to encourage LID

- Modify existing language to remove barriers to doing LID
- 2. Allow LID to count for various public benefits

The amendments...

- ...do not require applicant to do LID
- ...do not prohibit anything allowed currently





SDOT - Changes to the Street & Sidewalk Use Code

Add review considerations to minimize:

- impervious surface
- loss of vegetation
- stormwater runoff

Clarify protections and requirements for:

- green stormwater infrastructure
- pervious paving
- vegetation and street trees
- use of heavy equipment
