**Legislation Title:** A RESOLUTION relating to the Madison Corridor Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Project; adopting the Madison Corridor BRT Locally Preferred Alternative (LPA); and endorsing efforts to pursue federal funding for the Madison BRT Project.

**Summary and background of the Legislation:** This legislation approves the Madison Corridor BRT Locally Preferred Alternative (LPA) and endorses the pursuit of federal funding for the project, including progressing through the project development phase of the Federal Transit Administration's Small Starts program.

  Move Seattle's timeline for the Madison BRT Project has service beginning in 2019.

  This requires entry into the project development phase by early 2016. Not implementing the legislation would impact the ability of SDOT to advance this project on the proposed schedule.

Specific design decisions and construction impacts will be managed with the goal of advancing the principles of the Race and Social Justice Initiative.

What are the long-term and measurable goals of the program? Please describe how

The Madison Corridor BRT Project is the first new corridor in the BRT Network

envisioned in the Levy to Move Seattle. It would help advance the Move Seattle promise of 72% of residents having access to 10-minute or better all-day transit service within a 10-minute walk of their residence by 2025.
