1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to taxicab, transportation network company, and for-hire vehicle drivers; amending Section 6.310.110; adding a new Section 6.310.735 to the Seattle Municipal Code; authorizing the election of driver representatives.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation establishes a framework that would require companies that hire or contract with for-hire drivers licensed to operate in the City to bargain the terms and conditions of work with a Driver Representative if a sufficient number of such drivers chose to be represented.

For-hire drivers are generally considered to be in independent contractors and as such are not covered by the National Labor Relations Act that provides for collective bargaining between employers and unions representing employees. This legislation establishes a framework locally to allow drivers to organize and bargain, through a selected representative, with the companies they work for. Through this legislation, the City would establish the process by which the driver representative is selected, and compels the parties to bargain. It also establishes penalties for failure to comply including the possible revocation of regulatory licenses.

Revenues would be raised through fees and penalties from industry participants in the taxi, forhire, and transportation network companies. The Director has the authority to increase these fees without Council action. The legislation requires approximately \$0.06 increase in the per-trip fee or an equivalent flat amount for taxi, for-hire and TNC rides originating in the City of Seattle. This fee increase does not cover the entire anticipated cost in 2016, but will break even after 10 years if current trip increase trends continue.

A very large number of for-hire drivers come from historically disadvantaged communities. Many are new immigrants to the US and English is not their first language, making it difficult for them to find jobs. Driving taxis, flat-rate, and TNC-endorsed vehicles is often the fastest and easiest path to regular work for them. Unfortunately, because they are vulnerable, they are often taken advantage of by the companies that hire them or contract with them. This legislation provides a mechanism to redress the imbalance of market power the currently exists in the industry.
