### 1. BILL SUMMARY

## **Legislation Title:**

A RESOLUTION declaring The City of Seattle's intention to conduct a public hearing concerning the assumption of the rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the Seattle Transportation Benefit District by The City of Seattle.

# Summary and background of the Legislation:

Chapter 36.74 RCW authorizes any city or county that has established a transportation benefit district with coterminous boundaries to assume the rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the transportation benefit district. RCW 36.74.020 requires an ordinance or resolution to announce a public hearing to consider the matter.

This Resolution sets a time and place for a public hearing on assuming the rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the Seattle Transportation Benefit District for June 7, 2016, during the City Council Sustainability and Transportation Committee meeting, which is scheduled to begin at 2:00 p.m. in City Council Chambers.

After the public hearing, City Council will consider separate legislation to assume the rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the Seattle Transportation Benefit District.
