### 1. BILL SUMMARY

**Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Plumbing Code; amending Section 22.502.016 of the Seattle Municipal Code and adopting by reference Chapter 51-56 of the Washington Administrative Code with amendments, except Sections 51-56-008 and 51-56-0100; adopting a new Chapter 1 related to administration, permitting, and enforcement; and repealing Ordinance 124615 and Sections 3-12 of Ordinance 124274.

## Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation adopts the 2015 Seattle Plumbing Code (SPC), consisting of the 2015 Uniform Plumbing Code and Seattle amendments. The legislation is one of nine coordinated bills updating the regulations regarding construction and use of buildings in Seattle.

The SPC is based on current state and national standards for building construction, and State law requires local jurisdictions to enforce the code. The SPC was reviewed by the City's Construction Codes Advisory Board (CCAB) in a series of meetings over a several month period. The Board recommends the SPC for your approval.

The most significant changes in the 2015 Seattle Plumbing Code are included in the highlights section below:

## Highlights of changes in 2015 Seattle Plumbing Code

Most of Seattle's amendments to the Uniform Plumbing Code are being carried forward from the 2012 Plumbing Code. Most of the changes in the Uniform Plumbing Code, the Washington State Code, and the Seattle amendments are technical changes that will not have a major impact on construction. The most significant of the changes are listed here.

#### Section 423.0:

Updated to provide clarity and reduce unnecessary complexity by relying more on manufacturer's instructions rather than developing finite technical requirements that vary across systems.
