1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Fuel Gas Code; amending Section 22.420.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code and adopting by reference Chapters 2 through 8 of the 2015 International Fuel Gas Code, and amending those chapters; adopting a new Chapter 1 for the Seattle Fuel Gas Code related to administration, permitting, and enforcement; and repealing Sections 2-8 of Ordinance 124276.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This legislation adopts the 2015 Seattle Fuel Gas Code (SFGC), consisting of the 2015 International Fuel Gas Code and Seattle amendments. The legislation is one of nine coordinated bills updating the regulations regarding construction and use of buildings in Seattle.

The SFGC is based on current state and national standards for building construction, and State law requires local jurisdictions to enforce the code. The SFGC was reviewed by the City's Construction Codes Advisory Board (CCAB) in a series of meetings over a several month period. The Board recommends the SFGC for your approval.

The most significant changes in the 2015 Seattle Fuel Gas Code are included in the highlights section below:

Highlights of changes in 2015 Seattle Fuel Gas Code

Most of Seattle's amendments to the International Fuel Gas Code are being carried forward from the 2012 Fuel Gas Code. Most of the changes in the International Fuel Gas Code, the Washington State Code, and the Seattle amendments are technical changes that will not have a major impact on construction. The most significant of the changes are listed here.

Definitions:

The definition for "Boiler" and "Water Heater" have been modified to match those definitions in the Seattle Plumbing Code, Boiler Code, and Seattle Residential Code.
