## SAND POINT YOUTH HOMES

Youth Care and Friends of Youth Group Homes:

Authorization of new leases and amendment to existing lease





### Brief history of the Sand Point Group Homes

- Buildings were constructed in 1939 and used as Navy officer quarters until1993.
- The City of Seattle took ownership of the Sand Point Naval Air Station in 1997 with the condition in the base re-use plan to include 200 units of housing for homeless families and individuals.
- In alignment with the re-use plan, the Youth Homes were renovated in 1999 and repurposed for use as group homes for teenagers and young adults, operated by Friends of Youth and Youth Care.



## Housing and Services Provided

#### Youth Care's Passages and Pathways Programs:

- □ Buildings 331 and 332.
- 19 total homeless units.
- Tenants include homeless young adults ages 18 through 21.

#### Friend's of Youth New Ground Sand Point Program:

- Building 330.
- 8 homeless units.
- Tenants include homeless pregnant and parenting mothers ages 18 through 21.

#### **Services:**

- On-site case managers assist tenants with education, stability, self-sufficiency and building positive connections.
- In addition, New Ground focuses on improving parent's and child's well-being.



### **Proposed Transaction**

The partial termination and new leases require Council approval.

Approval of this transaction will allow the service & housing providers to work directly with OH staff.

- OH awarded \$562,382 and \$294,605 to Youth Care and Friends of Youth respectively in 2015 for recapitalization.
- Historic homes will be renovated and rehabbed to extend their life-cycle by 20 years.
- Amend and restate the original lease, excluding buildings 330, 331 and 332.
- Establish a new lease directly with FOY & YC for 330, 331, and 332, the current service providers and building operators.
