### 1. BILL SUMMARY

**Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE relating to City employment; amending Section 4.04.030 of the Seattle Municipal Code; authorizing a Memorandum of Understanding between The City of Seattle and certain City unions; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

# Summary and background of the Legislation:

The City is currently engaged in several large projects, such as the Summit Re-Implementation project and the New Customer Information System. Regularly appointed employees need to be and have been assigned to these projects for continuity of operations after the projects complete. Term-limited temporary workers are performing the "regular" body of work of regularly appointed employees who are assigned to these projects. This legislation authorizes a revision to the Seattle Municipal Code to permit such use of term-limited temporary workers, and authorizes a memorandum of understanding ("MOU") between the City and certain labor unions to do the same.
