**Subject:** Process for Budget Committee Votes on Revised Balancing Package \*

As Central Staff Budget Coordinator Erik Sund has indicated to your budget leads, the Wednesday, November 16, agenda will consist of the Chair's Revised Balancing Package, including green sheets for budget related legislation. The Package will be broken into three budget action groups:

- (1) Statements of Legislative Intent (SLI)
- (2) Budget Actions Affecting Appropriations
- (3) Budget Legislation.

Each group will be subject to a single vote unless a Councilmember moves to separate an item from the group for a separate vote (see process outlined below).

Amendments to the Agenda will be moved during the Adoption of the Agenda. The Chair will move to adopt the agenda. At this point, a Councilmember who desires to add a budget action to the agenda for consideration will move to amend the agenda. This motion requires a second and then requires an affirmative vote of the majority of the committee members present. All items added to the agenda during the meeting will be up for individual vote immediately following consideration of the related budget action group which the added item relates. For example, a new SLI added to the agenda will be considered (voted on) immediately after the vote on the group of SLIs that are part of the Chair's Revised Balancing Package along with the SLIs that were removed from the group. Added SLIs and removed SLIs will be considered in numerical order by budget action number.

**Substitutions** will not be considered during the adoption of the Agenda. If a Councilmember wishes to substitute one budget action for one in the revised balancing package, that budget action will need to be removed from the group and considered separately. See items I, II and III below for further information on the consideration and passage of a substitution.

- E. Approval of Agenda
  - The Budget Chair will state, "If there is no objection, the agenda will be adopted."
  - AMENDMENTS: A Councilmember (CM) may move to amend the agenda to add a new budget action not included in the Revised Balancing Package (RBP).
    - i. A motion to add an item will require a second and then a majority vote (5 votes in the affirmative, assuming 8 or 9 members are present).
    - ii. Any new budget actions added to the agenda will be considered immediately following consideration of the related budget action group of items and dealt with in numerical order by budget action number.
    - iii. 20 copies of each proposed new budget action must be provided to the Deputy City Clerk by a Councilmember Office staff member no later than start of the Budget Committee meeting.

### **VOTING PROCESS**

- I. <u>Statements of Legislative Intent (SLIs) Group (Attachment 1)</u>
  - Budget Chair will ask if any member needs clarification on any item in the group.
  - Following discussion of the SLIs, the Budget Chair will indicate his <u>intent</u> to move to approve all the SLIs in this section as a group and ask if anyone wishes to remove an item from the group for an individual vote.
  - **REMOVAL FROM GROUP VOTE:** Any member may request that SLI or SLIs be removed for individual vote(s). A request for removal does not require a second or a vote.
    - i. To do this, the CM requests an item be removed from the SLI group.
    - *ii.* NOTE: The first step for moving a substitution is requesting removal of an item from a group.
    - *iii.* Any item removed will be held until the committee adopts the remaining budget actions in the group.
  - After all requests for removal are made, Budget Chair moves to adopt the modified group of SLIs. Passing the group will require a second and a majority vote.
  - Immediately following the vote on the modified SLI group, all removed and added SLI items will be brought back for individual vote, one at a time, in numerical order by budget action number.
  - **SUBSTITUTION:** During the discussion of any removed SLI, a Councilmember may move to substitute a different version of a SLI for a SLI that was removed from the group. Substitutions require a second and a majority vote.

Following the adoption of a substitution motion, there must be a second motion to pass the substituted version. This motion also requires a second and a majority vote.

#### II. Budget Actions Affecting Appropriations Group – (Attachment 2)

- Includes budget actions that add to or cut funding from the Mayor's 2016 Proposed Budget and includes provisos.
- Budget Chair will ask if any member needs clarification on any item in the group.
- Budget Chair will indicate his <u>intent</u> to move to approve all the items in this section as a group.
- **REMOVAL FROM GROUP VOTE:** The Budget Chair will ask if anyone wants to remove an item for an individual vote.
  - *i.* Any member may request that any item be removed for individual vote. A request for removal does not require a second or a vote
  - *ii.* NOTE: The first step for moving a substitution is requesting removal of an item from a group.
  - *iii.* Any item removed will be held until the committee adopts the remaining budget actions in the group.
- After all requests for removal are made, Budget Chair moves to adopt the modified group of budget actions. Passing the group will require a second and a majority vote.
- Immediately following the vote on the modified group of budget actions, all removed and added items will be brought back for individual vote, one at a time, in numerical order by budget action number.
- SUBSTITUTION: During the discussion of any removed action in this group, a
  Councilmember may move to substitute a different budget action for a budget action
  that was tabled. Substitutions require a second and a majority vote.

Following the adoption of a substitution motion, there must be a second motion to pass the substituted version. This motion also requires a second and majority vote.

#### III. Budget Legislation Group – (Attachment 3)

- Includes green sheets for budget legislation. Note that not all budget legislation will be
  acted on during the meeting on November 16 (Votes on Chair's RBP). Some legislation,
  such as the budget adoption ordinance, cannot be completed without first knowing
  what other items have been approved and so will be voted on in Committee on the
  morning of November 21.
- Budget Chair will ask if any member needs clarification on any item in the group.
- Budget Chair will indicate his <u>intent</u> to move to approve all the items in this section as a group.
- **REMOVAL FROM GROUP VOTE:** The Budget Chair will ask if anyone wishes to remove an item from the group for an individual vote.
  - *i.* Any member may request that any item be removed for individual vote. A request for removal does not require a second or a vote
  - *ii.* NOTE: The first step for moving a substitution is requesting removal of an item from a group.
  - *iii.* Any item removed will be held until the committee adopts the remaining budget actions in the group.
- After all requests for removal are made, Budget Chair moves to adopt the modified group of Budget Legislation. Passing the group will require a second and a majority vote.
- Immediately following the vote on the modified group of Budget Legislation, all removed and added Budget Legislation items will be brought back for individual vote, one at a time, in numerical order by budget action number.
- **SUBSTITUTION:** During the discussion of any removed budget legislation, a Councilmember may move to substitute a different version budget action for a budget action that was removed. Substitutions require a second and a majority vote.

Following the adoption of a substitution motion, there must be a second motion to pass the substituted version. This motion also requires a second and majority vote.
