Background

Pilot launched in 2014 with goal of streets for:

- Safe, active play
- Social interaction
- Increased public space
- Maintaining access



Legislation

Clarify a potential point of confusion between two code sections

- SMC 11.16.125 SDOT Director granted authority to permit the closing of streets
- SMC 11.40.260 Prohibits "any sport, amusement or exercise or play" in roadway
- Amendment to SMC 11.40 acknowledging SDOT's existing permitting authority by noting that play in the roadway is allowed with an SDOT closure permit
