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b. an interim assignment for short-term replacement of a regular employee of up to one year when the incumbent is temporarily absent; or

- c. a short-term assignment of up to one year, which may be extended beyond one year only while the assignment is in the process of being converted to a regular position, to perform work that is not ongoing regular work and for which there is no regularly budgeted position; or
- d. a less than half-time assignment for seasonal, on-call, intermittent or regularly scheduled work that normally does not exceed 1,040 hours in a year, but may be extended up to 1,300 hours once every three years and may also be extended while the assignment is in the process of being converted to a regular position; or
- e. a term-limited assignment for a period of more than one but less than three years for time-limited work related to a specific project, grant or other non-routine substantial body of work((5 or)); for the replacement of a regularly appointed employee when that employee is absent on long-term disability time loss, medical or military leave of absence; or for the replacement of a regularly appointed employee who is assigned to special time-limited project work.

For purposes of administering temporary assignments, one year shall be equivalent to 26 consecutive pay periods. The Seattle Human Resources Director may promulgate rules that direct departments to limit temporary assignments to fewer hours than this ordinance provides for.

Except as may be provided by ordinance or labor contract, temporary workers shall be exempt from the provisions of this ((title)) <u>Title 4</u>.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

By and Between

CITY OF SEATTLE

And

CERTAIN CITY UNIONS

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into between the City of Seattle ("City") and the unions signatory to this MOU ("Unions"). Collectively, the City and the Unions shall be known as "the Parties."

1. Most collective bargaining agreements contain provisions defining a temporary worker and limiting the conditions under which temporary work may be assigned. For "term-limited" temporary assignments, the parties agree to amend their collective bargaining agreements to remove the existing provision describing the conditions under which term-limited work may be assigned and replace it with the language in Section 2 of this MOU.

The terms temporary employee and temporary worker shall be defined to include both temporary and less than half time employees and means a person who is employed in: ...

- 2. a term-limited assignment for a period of more than one but less than three years for time-limited work related to a specific project, grant or other non-routine substantial body of work; for the replacement of a regularly appointed employee when that employee is absent on long-term disability time loss, medical or military leave of absence; or for the replacement of a regularly appointed employee who is assigned to special time-limited project work.
- 3. Unions signatory to this MOU whose collective bargaining agreements do not contain provisions related to term-limited temporary work but who represent temporary workers agree to the conditions of assigning term-limited temporary work provided in Section 2 of this MOU.
