2016 RSJI Accomplishments

Equity Area: Health

Seattle/King County Clinic (SKCC) – 4,492 patients from broad range of targeted populations received access to free dental, vision and medical services. 60% of the patients identified as Non-White.

Equity Area: Jobs/Economic Development

Expanded Mayor's Youth Employment Initiative (MYEI) by 300% to 29 interns, and integrated resident organizations into program to leverage resources across campus. 97% students of color.

Equity Area: Service Equity

Accommodated and hosted 60 events presented by diverse community organizations through Seattle Center Festál and Community Created Events.

Equity Area: Criminal Justice

Quarterly RSJI Lunch & Learns, open to SC and City employees and campus residents, focused on the Schools to Prison Pipeline, Recidivism and Post-prison Education.















Highlights / Challenges

Highlights

- Created branding, formed new community partnerships and enhanced programming in preparation for 20th Anniversary of Seattle Center Festál in 2017.
- Sept. RSJI L & L presented Ari Kohn, President, Post Prison Education Program, on how his organization helps participants to regain their lives, families and homes.
- Two Community Created Events brought diverse audiences to Seattle Center. World Rhythm Festival drew world music artists and participants in 100 performances and workshops. Buddy Walk® celebrated and promoted inclusion and respect for individuals with Down syndrome.
- Increased WMBE purchasing utilization from 13% in 2015 to 20% in 2016, with 62% of WMBE purchasing from MBEs.










Highlights / Challenges

Challenges

- Scarcity of MBE consultants in architecture and engineering fields.
- Transitioning Seattle/King County Clinic and securing resources necessary to sustain the effort within the current healthcare climate.
- Identifying new partners and growing MYEI.

- Internal WMBE Team leads WMBE Utilization program.
- Team publishes monthly utilization reports.
- Department focuses on increasing MBE utilization.

2016 Use of Racial Equity Toolkit

- Mayor's Youth Employment Initiative (MYEI)

 Toolkit used to implement innovative pilot program that enhanced and augmented work experience for MYEI interns.
- 2) Seattle/King County Clinic Entry Process

 Toolkit used to determine engaging and child-focused activity offerings to enhance and humanize patient waiting process.
- 3) Master Planning Process Took 1st step in developing Toolkit to use as master planning process moves forward.









Toolkit Focus

Seattle/King County Clinic

- \$3.94 million in dental, vision and medical service provided free to 4,492 patients by 3,947 professional and community volunteers.
- Partnered with over 100 community, government and healthcare entities to produce successful clinic outcomes.
- Leveraged campus and community resources to provide engaging activities for individuals waiting for healthcare services.











Toolkit Focus

Seattle Center MYEI Pilot

- Toolkit used to produce internship experiences that leveraged campus wide resources and resulted in placement of 29 MYEI interns at 9 participating resident organizations.
- Weekly learning and engagement activities provided exposure to work sectors represented on Seattle Center grounds and offered life and work skills.
- Positive and constructive feedback from participants helped to shape 2017 program design.
