1. Work and contracts with same outcomes

- HSD does not currently fund connectors at food banks
- HSD funds other services that include information and referral support; the service models and outcomes vary and they are not located at food banks



2. Fit with existing portfolio of services

- Community Connectors align with HSD's mission and vision
- Embed in Youth and Family Empowerment Division where food bank and other similar contracts reside
- Expedited RFQ to stand-up the pilot in 2017
- Contracts monitored by program specialists with other food or social service contracts

3. How duplication will be prevented

- Intentional peer learning, networking with other providers, ongoing evaluation of pilot program effectiveness
- Focus on clients not receiving services



4. Achievement of outcomes

- Pilot period August 2017 December 2018
- Uniform data collection
- Concrete outcomes outlined in agency contracts



5. Evaluation

- Results Based Accountability Framework
- Clearly outlined in agency contracts



Recommendations

- Lift the proviso
 - o 2017 budget is \$355,000
 - 2018 budget is \$475,000
 - o 2017-18 budget is \$830,000
- HSD will launch pilot program
 - Select providers through expedited RFQ
 - Community Connector services will be piloted across council districts
 - Build on learnings for 2019 Food and Meals RFP
