17	A. <u>1.</u> Following the issuance of <u>SPD and OPA shall confer with and respond in</u>
18	writing within 30 days to any oversight entity issuing written recommendations to SPD by the
19	OPA Director, the Inspector General, or CPC issued pursuant to contained in reports required by
20	this Chapter 3.29, SPD shall confer with and respond in writing to the issuing entity within 30
21	days following the release of the recommendations. In For any accepted recommendations, the
22	response , SPD shall provide a plan for implementation of accepted recommendations, including
23	<u>a plan</u> for regular timely-written progress reportson progress made in implementing accepted
24	recommendations, and an explanation for those recommendations not accepted or not scheduled
25	for implementation. For any recommendations not accepted or not scheduled for implementation,
26	the response shall provide an explanation of why not. If the lead entity responsible for the
27	implementation of any recommendation is a City department or office other than SPD <u>or OPA</u> ,

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1	the Director of the Mayor's Office of Policy and Innovation or its successor shall coordinate
2	providing the necessary information to SPD to-include in the response. The issuing agency shall
3	be responsible for tracking the status of its recommendations accepted and not accepted. The
4	OPA Director and the Inspector General shall report quarterly to CPC on the status of SPD's
5	response to their recommendations regarding SPD and other City departments and agencies.
6	B. OPA shall meet and confer with the issuing agency following the issuance of any
7	written report with recommendations by the Inspector General or CPC issued pursuant to this
8	Chapter 3.29 and shall respond in writing to the issuing agency within 30 days following the
9	release of recommendations of the Inspector General or CPC, providing a plan for
10	implementation of accepted recommendations, including regular timely written reports on
11	progress made in implementing accepted recommendations, and a rationale or other explanatory
12	information for those recommendations not accepted or scheduled for implementation. The
13	issuing agency shall be responsible for tracking the status of its recommendations accepted and
14	not accepted. The Inspector General shall report quarterly to CPC on the status of OPA's
15	response to OIG's recommendations regarding OPA.
16	C. <u>B.2.</u> The OPA Director, Inspector General, # the CPC Commissionerco-chairs, and the
17	Chief, or their designees, shall meet together at least quarterly to collectively review and verify
18	their positions on the implementation status of all recommendations.
19	3. CPC shall compile and maintain a database of all recommendations and their status, as
20	represented to CPC by the issuing entity. Following the quarterly meetings, CPC shall update
21	the database. CPC may include their analyses and comments.
