CM O'BRIEN TRACKING AMENDMENT 2A

This amendment would amend Proposed Amendment 8 to add that CPC staff would be responsible for tracking the status of all recommendations, to be updated after quarterly meetings. It would also add that one of the purposes of quarterly meetings amongst OPA, OIG, CPC, and SPD is to verify their positions on the status of all recommendations. The CPC Commissioner at those meetings would be the co-chairs or their designees.

Section 43. A new Subchapter IV, which includes new Sections 3.29.400, 3.29.410, 3.29.420, 3.29.430, 3.29.440, 3.29.450, 3.29.460, 3.29.470, and 3.29.480, is added to Chapter 3.29 of the Seattle Municipal Code as follows:

Subchapter IV Mechanisms to Support Accountability

3.29.410 Continuous improvement

A. 1. Following the issuance of SPD and OPA shall confer with and respond in writing within 30 days to any oversight entity issuing written recommendations to SPD by the OPA Director, the Inspector General, or CPC issued pursuant to contained in reports required by this Chapter 3.29, SPD shall confer with and respond in writing to the issuing entity within 30 days following the release of the recommendations. In For any accepted recommendations, the response, SPD shall provide a plan for implementation of accepted recommendations, including a plan for regular timely written progress reports. -on progress made in implementing accepted recommendations, and an explanation for those recommendations not accepted or not scheduled for implementation For any recommendations not accepted or not scheduled for implementation, the response shall provide an explanation of why not. If the lead entity responsible for the implementation of any recommendation is a City department or office other than SPD or OPA,

1	the Director of the Mayor's Office of Policy and Innovation or its successor shall coordinate
2	providing the necessary information to SPD to include in the response. The issuing agency shall
3	be responsible for tracking the status of its recommendations accepted and not accepted. The
4	OPA Director and the Inspector General shall report quarterly to CPC on the status of SPD's
5	response to their recommendations regarding SPD and other City departments and agencies.
6	B. OPA shall meet and confer with the issuing agency following the issuance of any
7	written report with recommendations by the Inspector General or CPC issued pursuant to this
8	Chapter 3.29 and shall respond in writing to the issuing agency within 30 days following the
9	release of recommendations of the Inspector General or CPC, providing a plan for
10	implementation of accepted recommendations, including regular timely written reports on
11	progress made in implementing accepted recommendations, and a rationale or other explanatory
12	information for those recommendations not accepted or scheduled for implementation. The
13	issuing agency shall be responsible for tracking the status of its recommendations accepted and
14	not accepted. The Inspector General shall report quarterly to CPC on the status of OPA's
15	response to OIG's recommendations regarding OPA.
16	C. <u>B.</u> 2. The OPA Director, Inspector General, # the CPC Commissioner co-chairs, and the
17	Chief, or their designees, shall meet together at least quarterly to collectively review and verify
18	their positions on the implementation status of all recommendations.
19	3. CPC staff shall compile and maintain a comprehensive database of all
20	recommendations. Following the quarterly meetings, CPC staff shall update the database to
21	accurately record the status of each recommendation.
