1. BILL SUMMARY

- **a.** Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Office for Civil Rights; amending Section 3.14.920 of the Seattle Municipal Code to increase the membership of the Seattle Human Rights Commission, the Seattle Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer (LGBTQ) Commission, and the Seattle Commission for People with Disabilities and change the appointment authority for these and the Seattle Women's Commission.
- b. Summary and background of the Legislation: This bill increases the number of commissioners on the Seattle Human Rights Commission, the Seattle LGBTQ Commissions, and the Seattle Commission for People with Disabilities from 15 per commission to 20 per commission. For these commissions and the Seattle Women's Commission, the bill changes the number of Mayoral appointments from nine to eight, the number of City Council appointments from nine to eight, and requires the commission to nominate four of the 20 appointed commissioners.
