## Here are the facts about Public Health's return on investment:

- The flu can cause 3,000 to 49,000 deaths a year, more than \$10 billion in direct medical expenses, and more than \$16 billion in lost earnings. By preventing hospitalizations, flu shots can save \$80 per year, per person vaccinated.
