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




Federal and State Local Public Health Funding Flat or Declining: 2008 – 2016


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
Local hospitals hit hard by flu cases; 8 dead in King County so far






Mumps outbreak









Based on the environmental assessment of the active case it was determined that 66 inmates needed to be evaluated further and of the 66 inmates 55 inmates were evaluated. The other inmates were released and are being pursued by the TB Control Program's Disease Research Investigation Specialist so they can be screened.
