

Background: <p>Dr. Jim Krieger is founding Executive Director of <u>Healthy Food America</u> and Clinical Professor of Medicine and Health Services at University of Washington. Healthy Food America is a non-profit that promotes healthy food policy through policy analysis, research, and public education. He previously worked for 25 years at Public Health – Seattle & King County as Chief of Chronic Disease Prevention and Chief of Assessment, Policy Development and Evaluation, and as a physician at Harborview Medical Center. He is a nationally recognized expert in using scientific evidence, policy, and programs to prevent obesity and chronic diseases, help people with chronic diseases improve their health, and promote health equity.</p> <p>He has provided technical assistance for adoption, implementation and evaluation of sugary drink taxes in over a dozen cities and counties in the US, including Seattle. His work has led to adoption of sugary drink taxes and other measures to reduce exposure to sugary drinks, and greater public awareness of the hazards of sugary drinks.</p> <p>He has developed and evaluated many programs to support healthy eating and increase access to healthy food in Seattle and King County, including healthy corner stores, incentive vouchers for low-income people to use at farmers markets, and healthier school lunchrooms. His work has led to improvements in school nutrition, implementation of the nation's second menu labeling regulation, and increased access to healthy foods for low income people.</p> <p>NIH, CDC, and many private foundations have funded his work. He was a member of the Institute of Medicine Committee on Local Government Action to Prevent Childhood Obesity and its Committee on Evaluating Progress in Obesity Prevention. He has received numerous awards, including the US Secretary of Health and Human Services Innovation in Prevention Award. He has authored more than 65 peer-reviewed publications. He received his undergraduate degree at Harvard, MD at the University of California, San Francisco and MPH at University of Washington.</p>
