## **1. BILL SUMMARY**

- a. **Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation to execute and accept from the Washington State Department of Natural Resources, on behalf of The City of Seattle, an Aquatic Lands Lease for Seattle's Waterfront Parks; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.
- b. **Summary and background of the Legislation:** This legislation authorizes the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation to execute an Aquatic Lands Lease with the State Department of Natural Resources (DNR) for Seattle's Waterfront Parks.
- c. **Background:** This proposed lease replaces and expands on two prior leases with DNR which expired in 1993 and 2004. The proposed lease has a term of 12 years commencing on September 1, 2017. There will be no fee for the permit, because the properties will be used for public park purposes.
