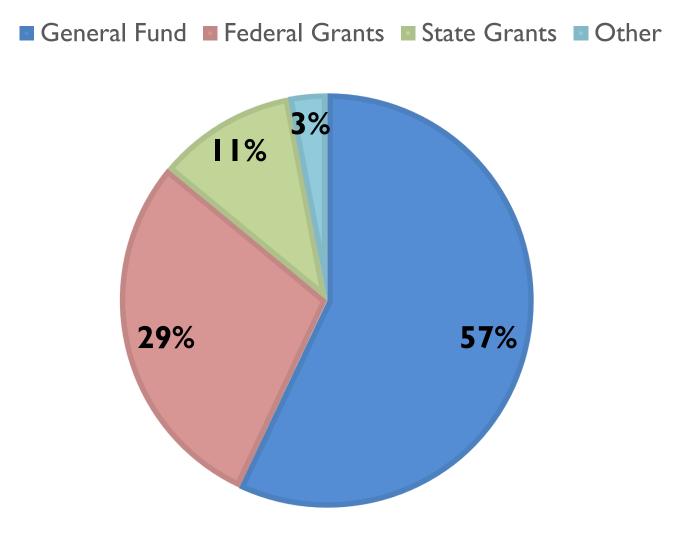

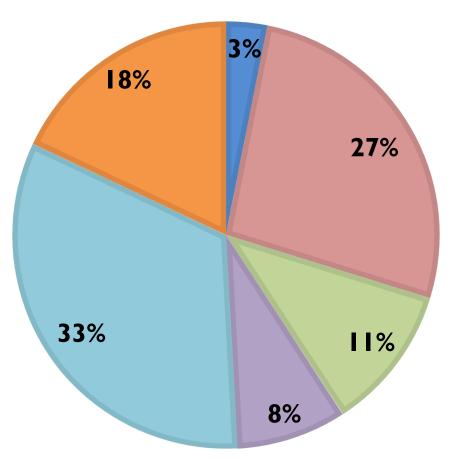

VETERANS, SENIORS, AND HUMAN SERVICES LEVY 2018 – 2023 | NOV. 7 BALLOT

Provide \$52.3M to \$65.9M a year (property tax levy of ~.10 per \$1,000 of assessed value)

*estimated annual amount increased by up to 3.5%, as approved on yearly basis by County Council

Funding supports health and human services and capital facilities in equal allocations for the following target populations:

- Veterans and service members and their families;
- Seniors (55+) and their caregivers; and
- Vulnerable populations

Implementation plan to be adopted by the County Council will authorize expenditure of levy proceeds

Mayor's Interim Plan to Address Unsheltered Homelessness

The Executive has indicated that \$4.5M in 2017 one-time funding for homelessness may continue in 2018
