1. BILL SUMMARY

a. Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE granting Pier 54, LLC permission to maintain and operate a pedestrian walkway and a covered patio, including benches, tables, food preparation and serving areas, outdoor lighting, pedestrian deck, pilings, and other related appurtenant structures in the public place on the north side of Madison Street, west of Alaskan Way, for a ten-year term, renewable for two successive ten-year terms; specifying the conditions under which this permit is granted; providing for the acceptance of the permit and conditions; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

b. Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation allows Pier 54, LLC to continue maintaining and operating the existing pedestrian walkway and a covered patio, including benches, tables, food preparation and serving areas, outdoor lighting, pedestrian deck, pilings, and other related appurtenant structures in the public place on the north side of Madison Street, west of Alaskan Way. The permit is for a period of ten years, commencing on the expiration of the last term on May 3, 2015. The permit may be extended for a successive 10-year term. The legislation specifies the conditions under which permission is granted.
