

- 8.5 miles from Northgate to Lynnwood, (~2 miles in City of Seattle)
- Mix of elevated & atgrade guideway
- Stations in Final Design:
  - o NE 145th Street
  - o NE 185th Street
  - o Mountlake Terrace
  - o Lynnwood Transit Center

- This amendment adds the Lynnwood Link alignment and makes no other changes




## Lynnwood Link Alignment in Seattle
